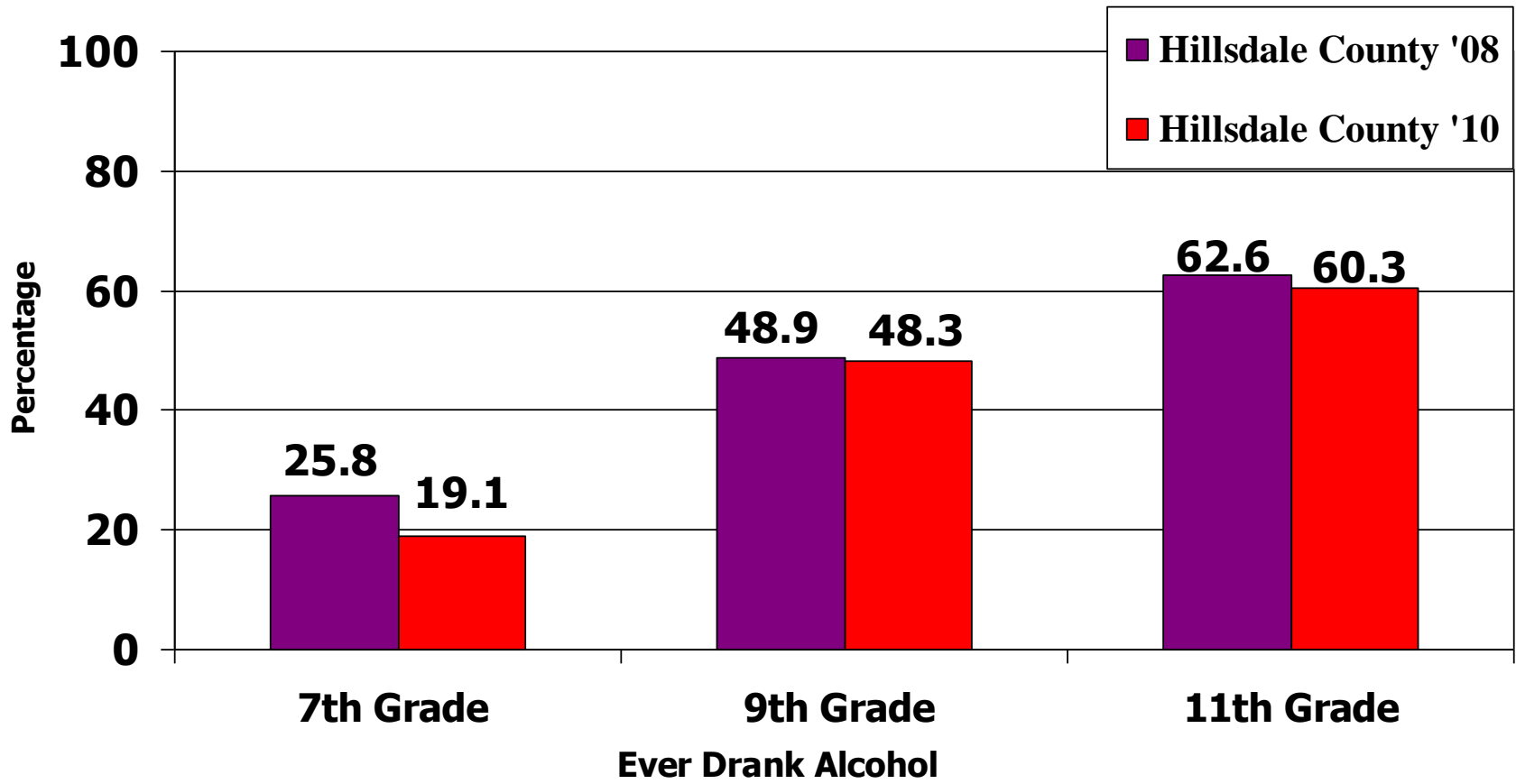

Percentage of students who ever drank alcohol

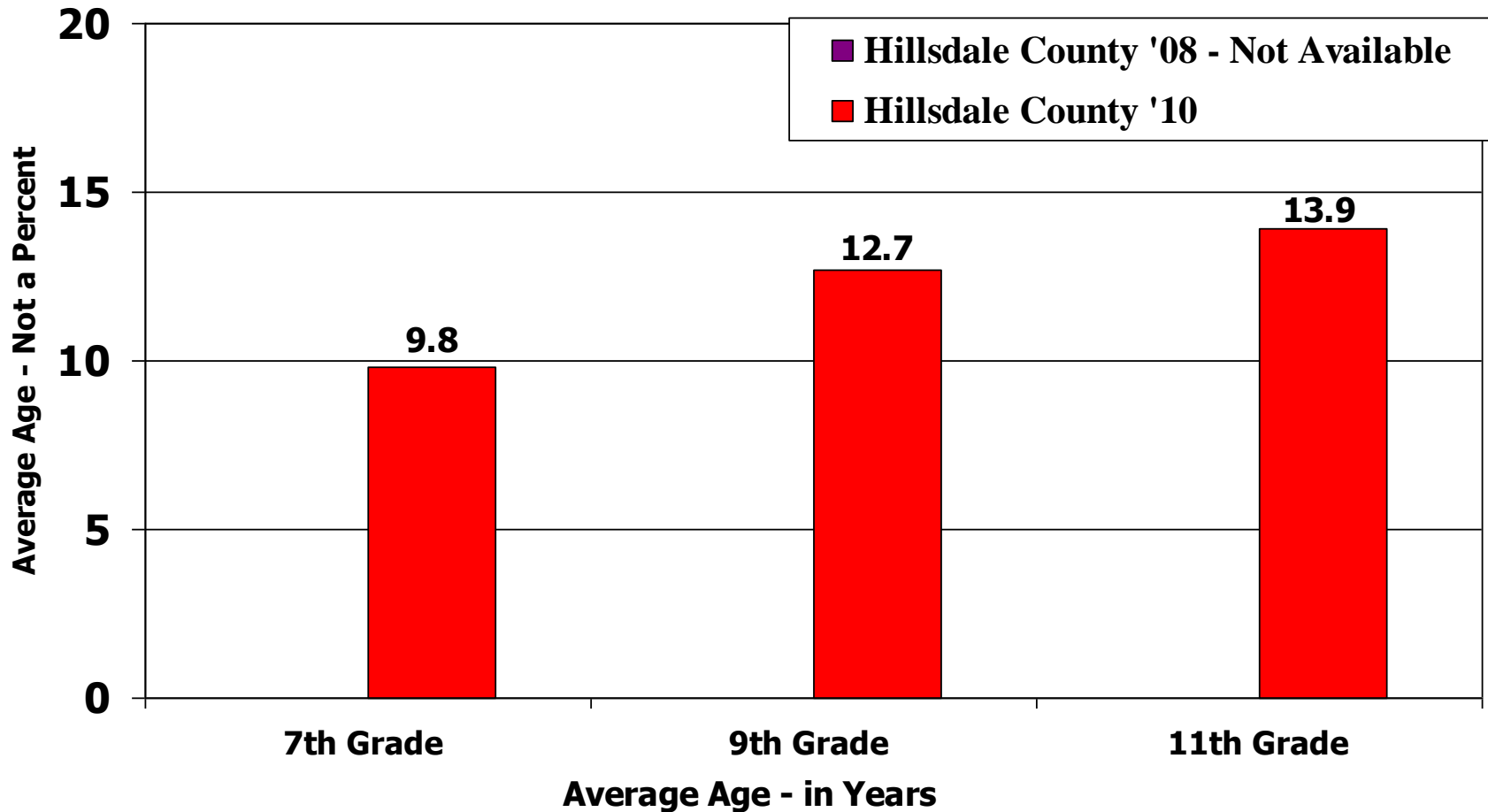

Average age of first alcohol use (Note – not a percentage)

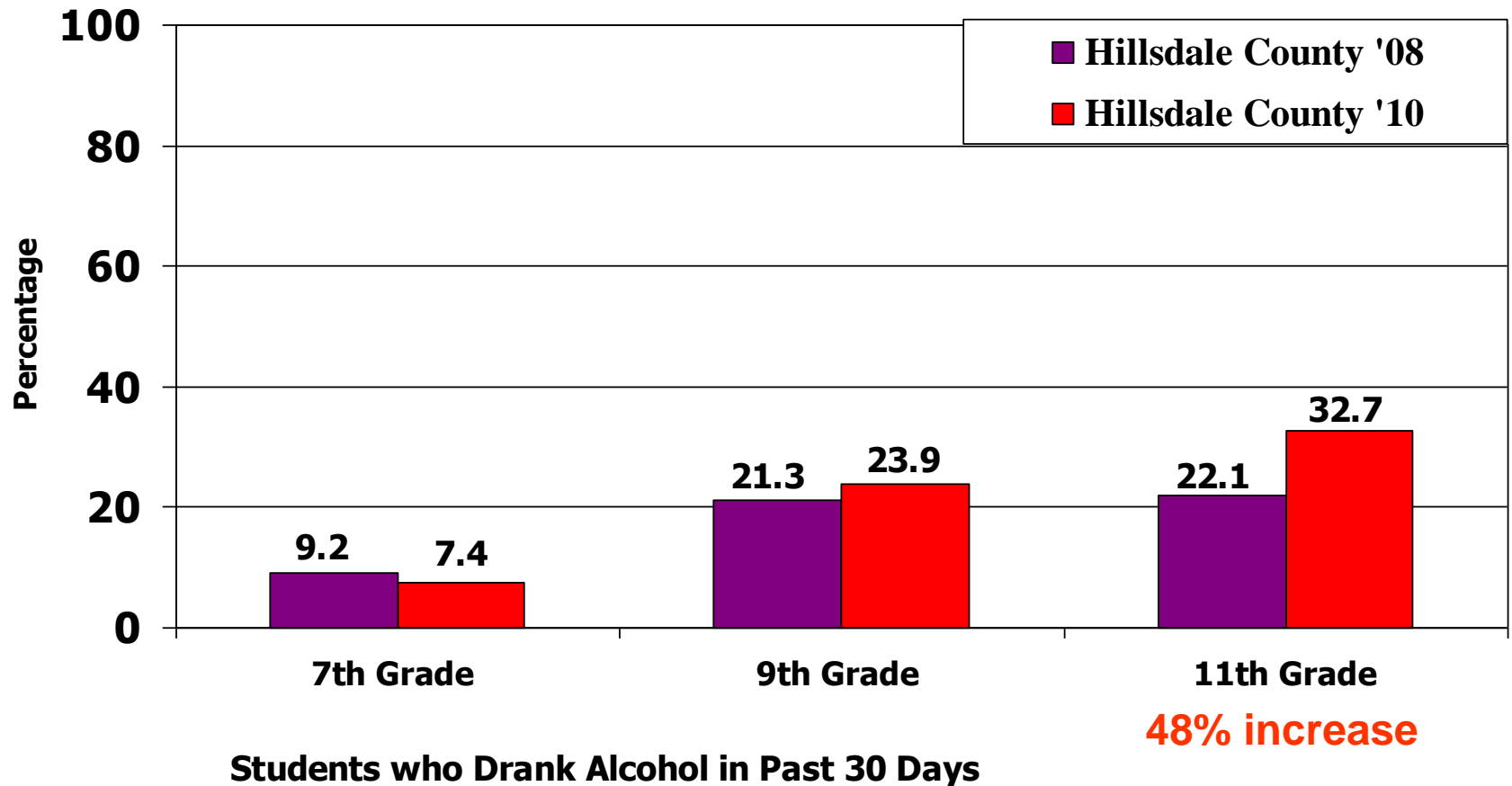

past 30 days (recent)

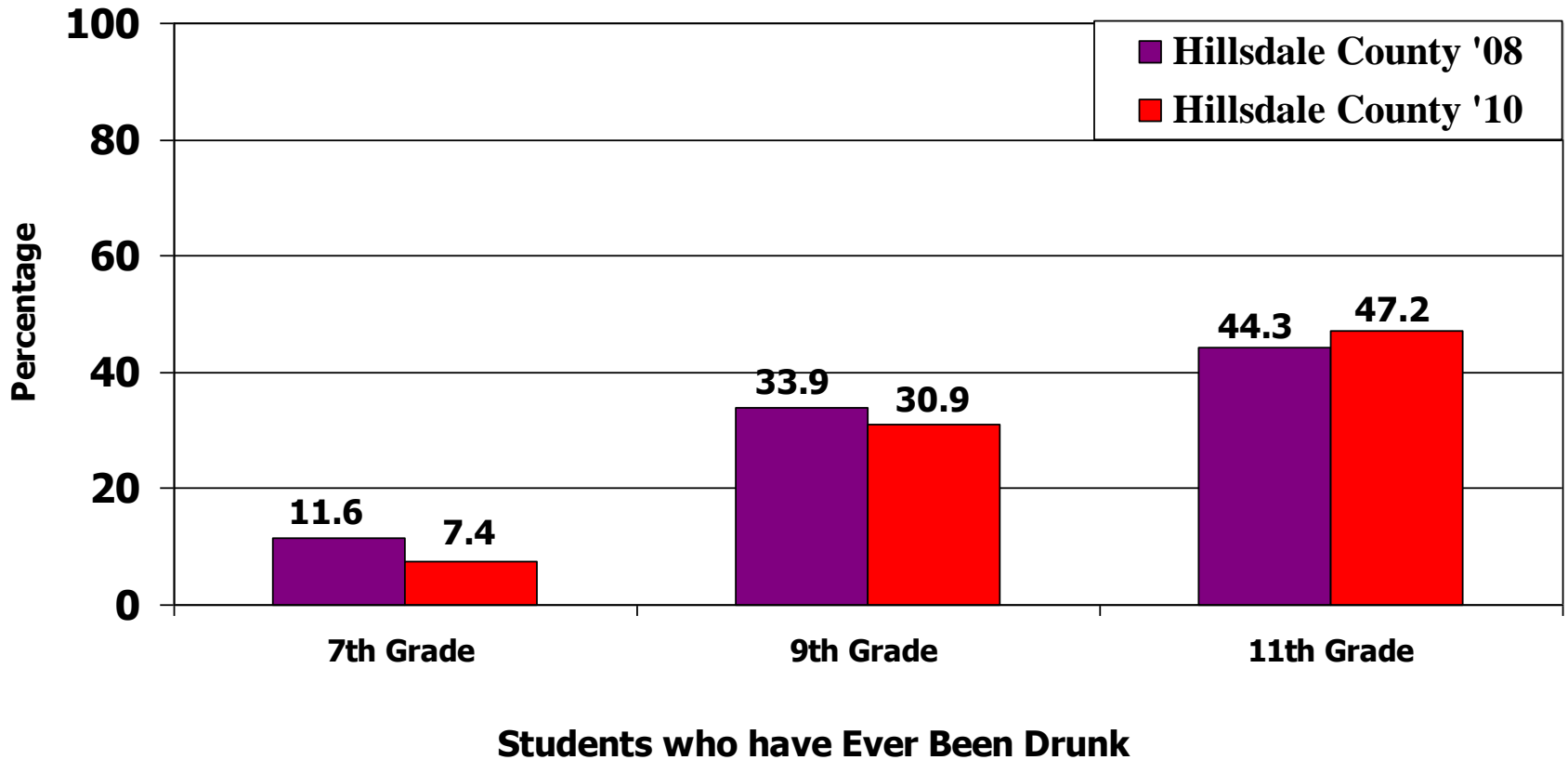

Percentage of students who have ever been drunk

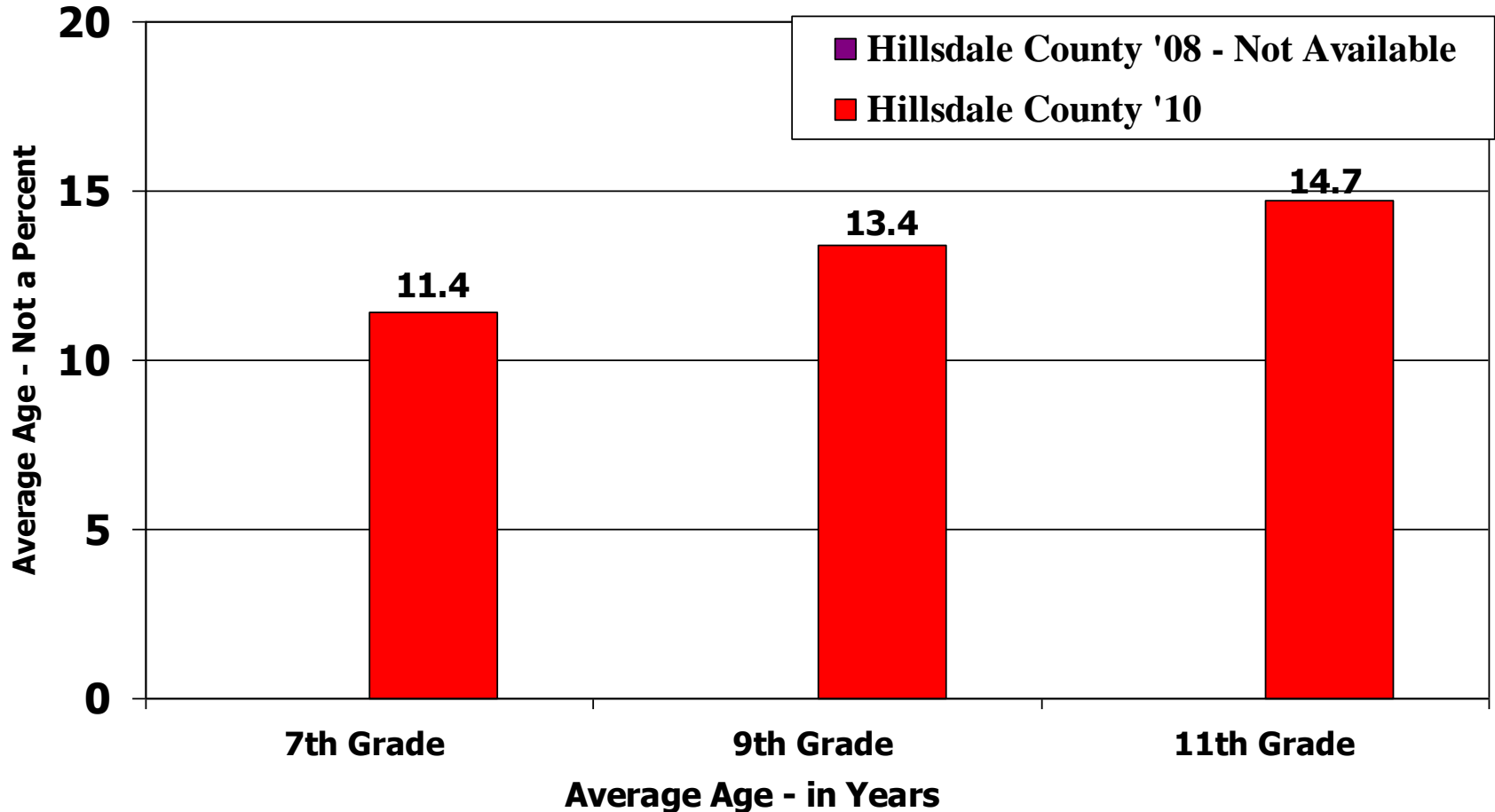

Average age of **first time being drunk** (Note – not a percentage)

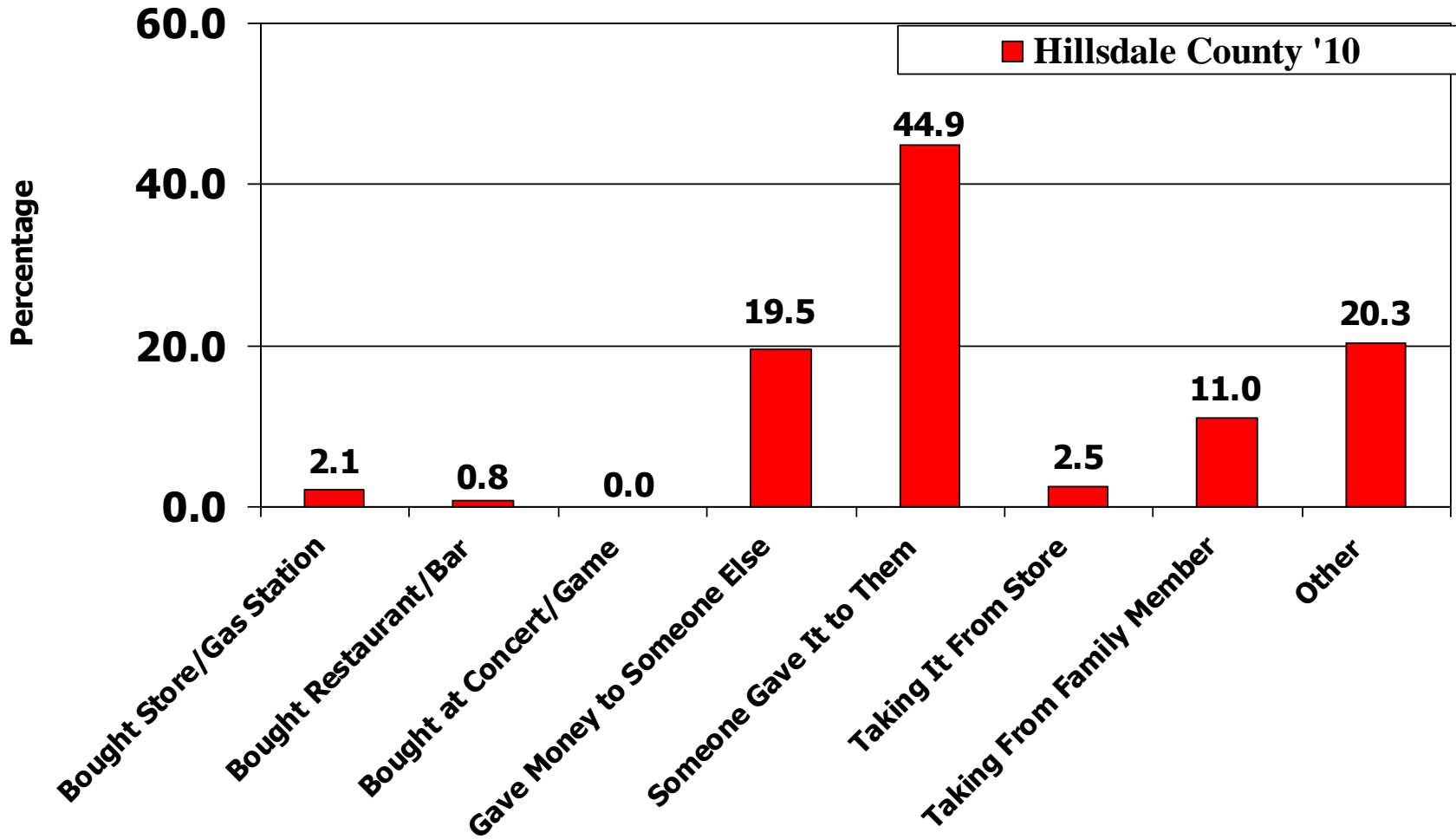

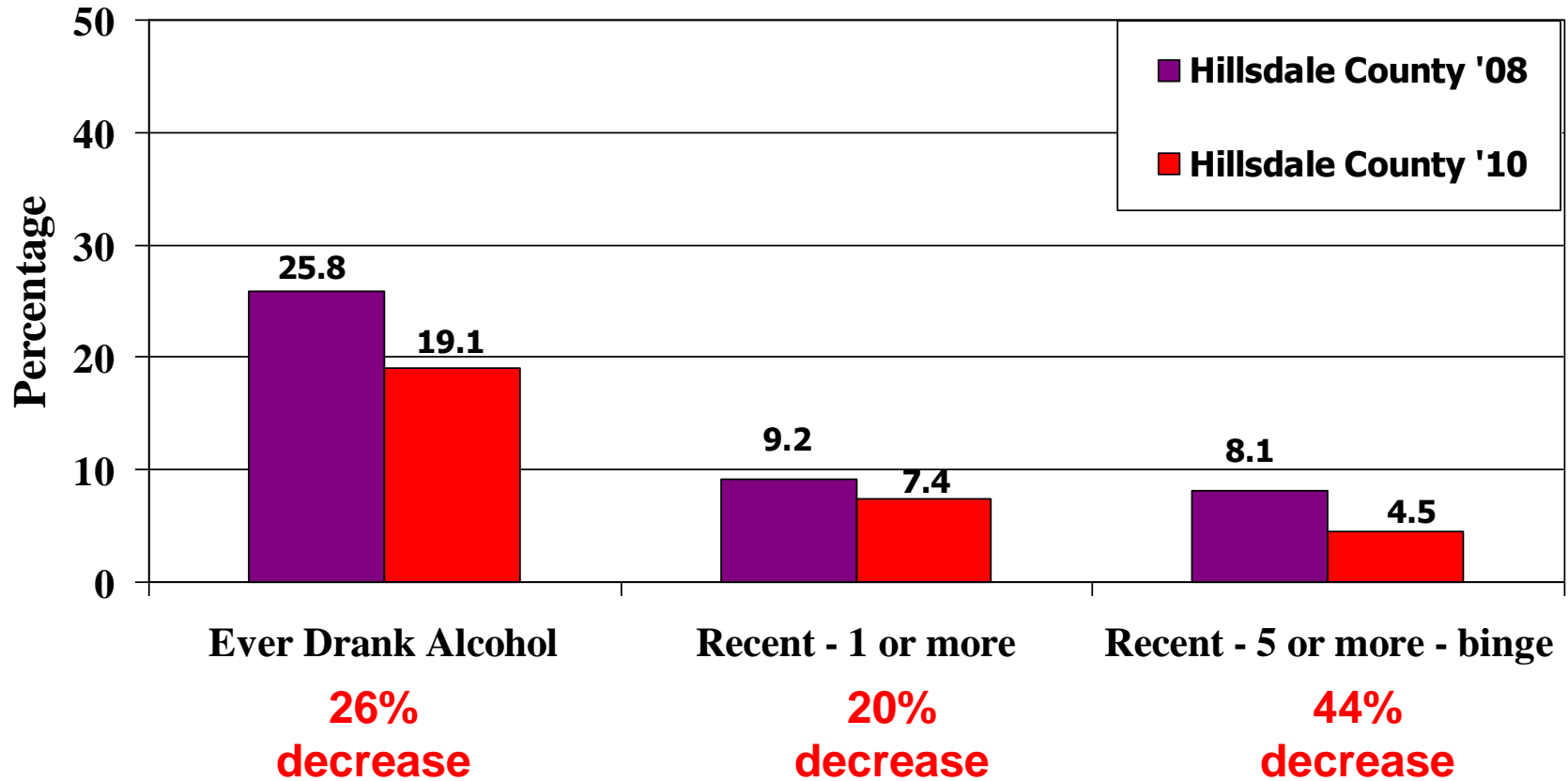

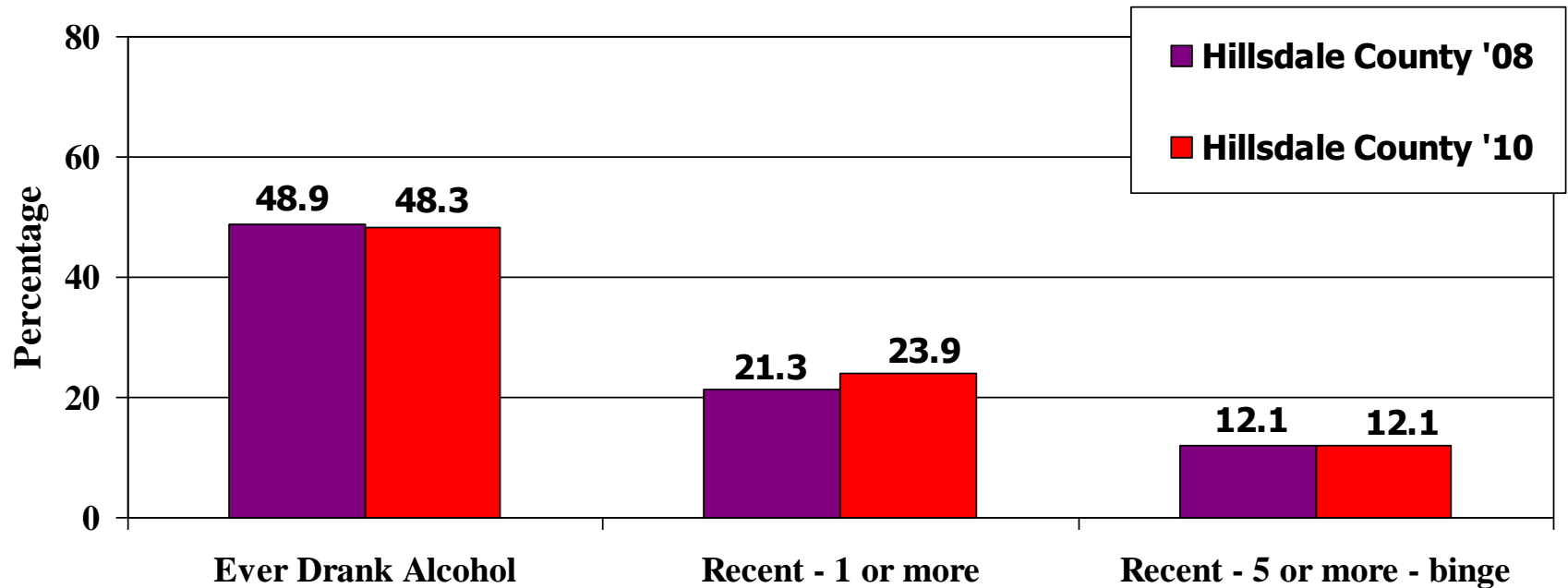

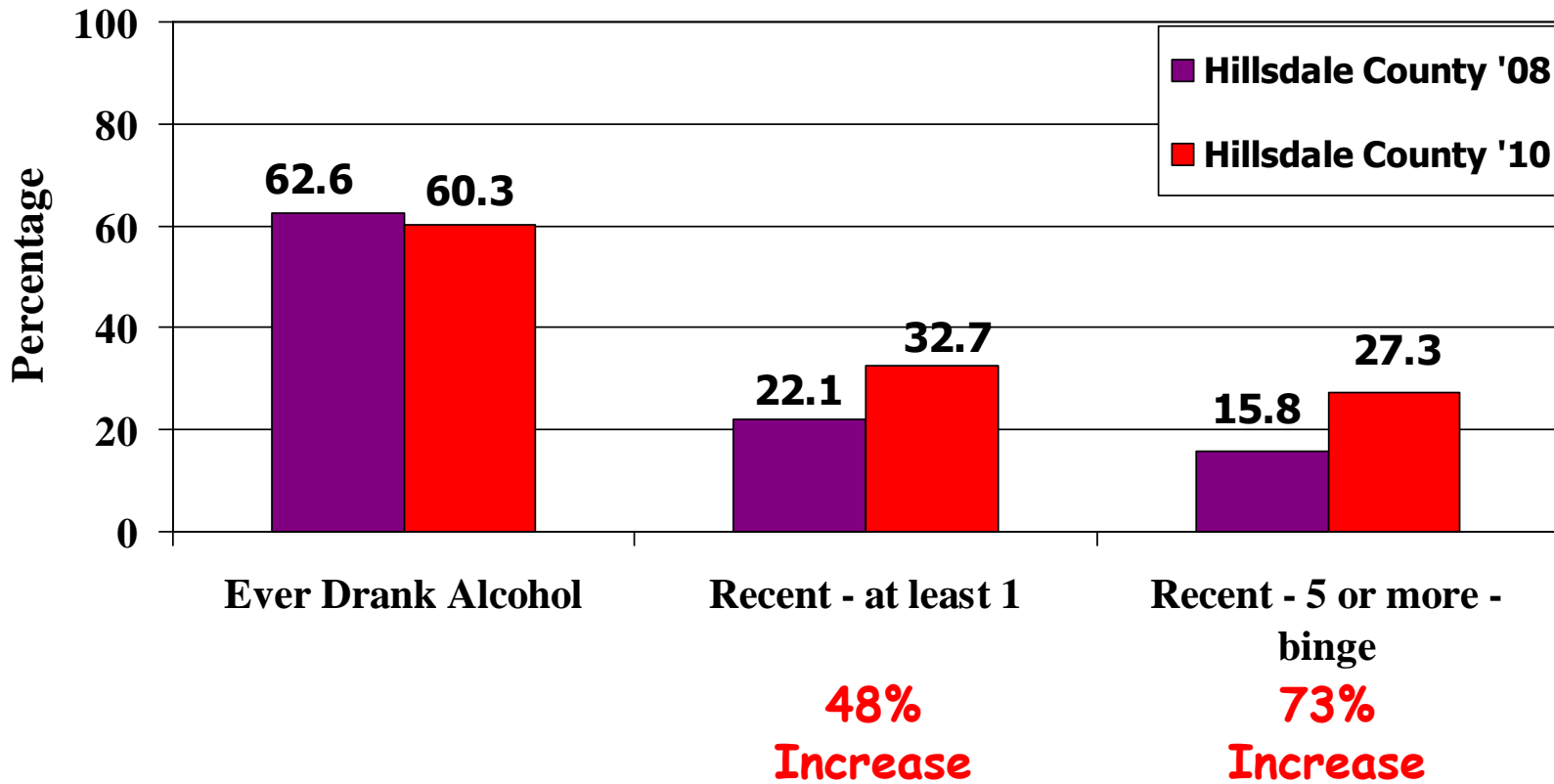

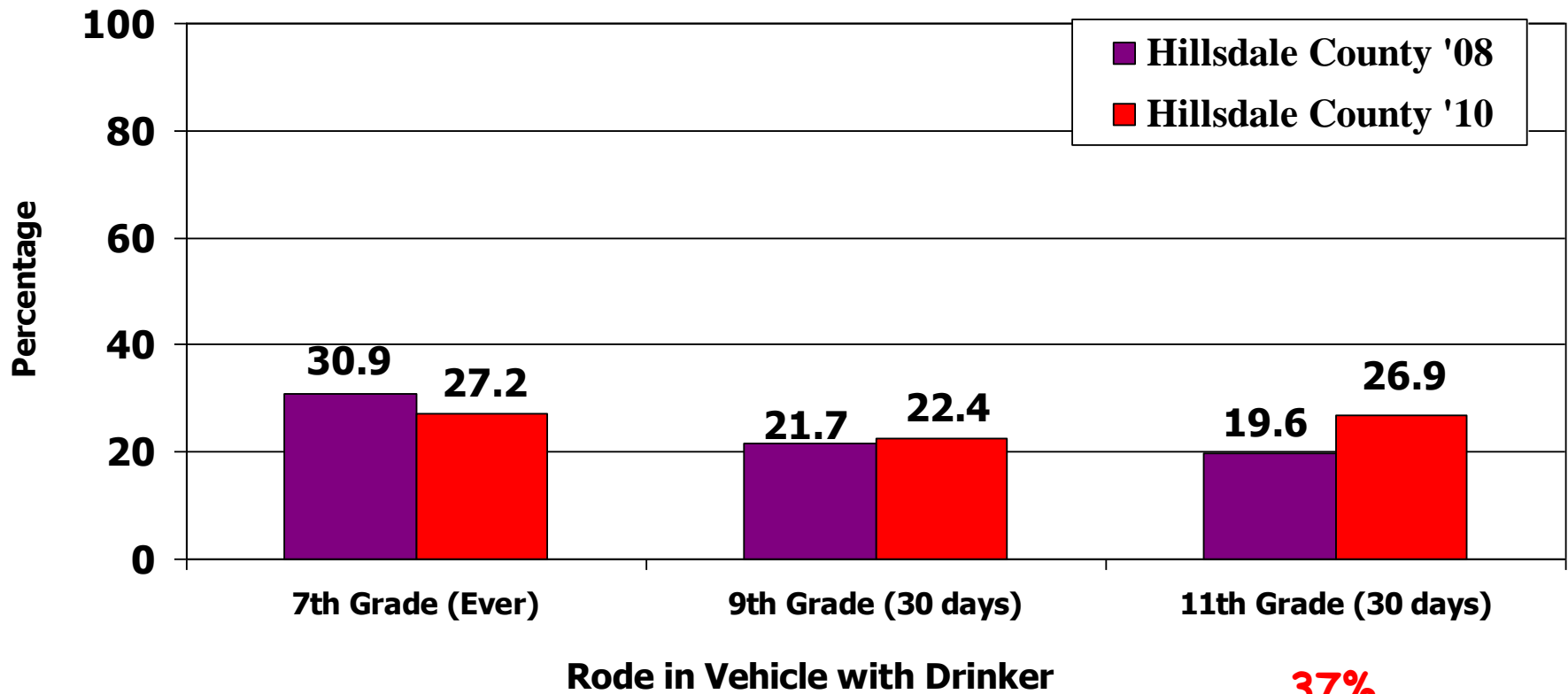

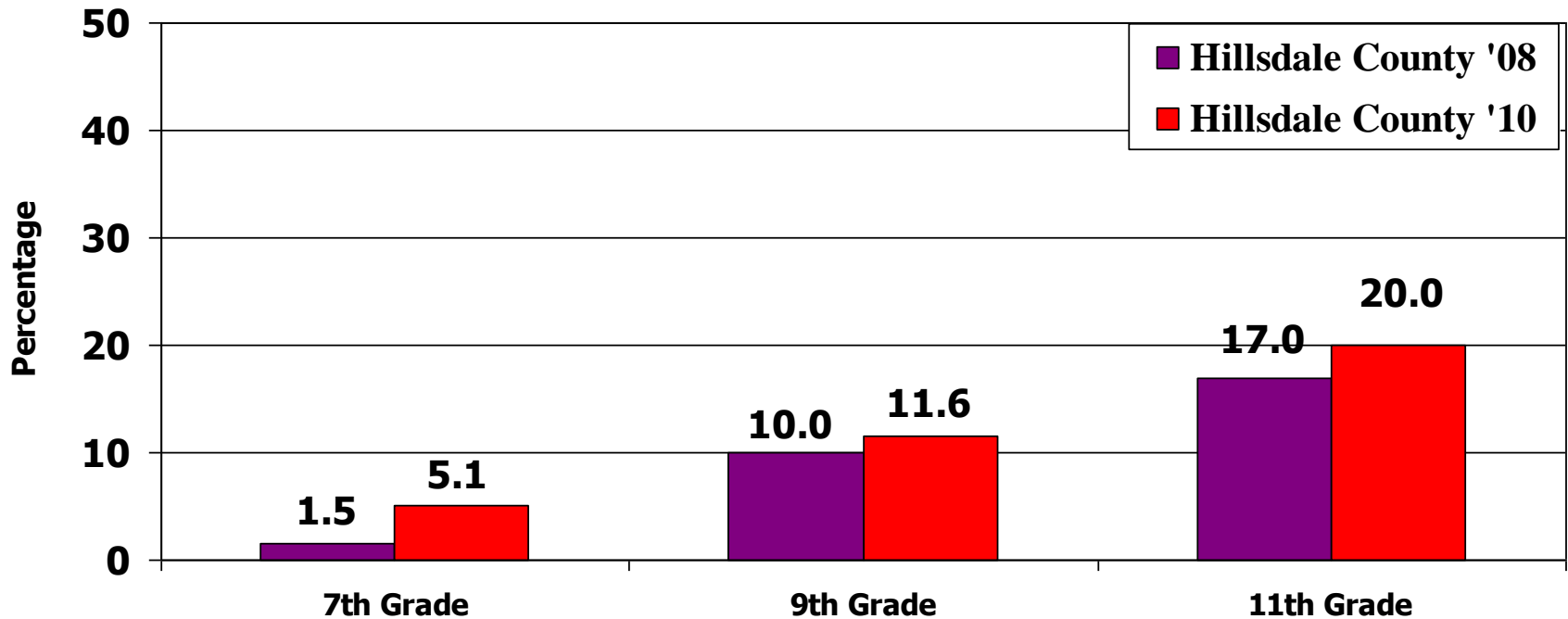

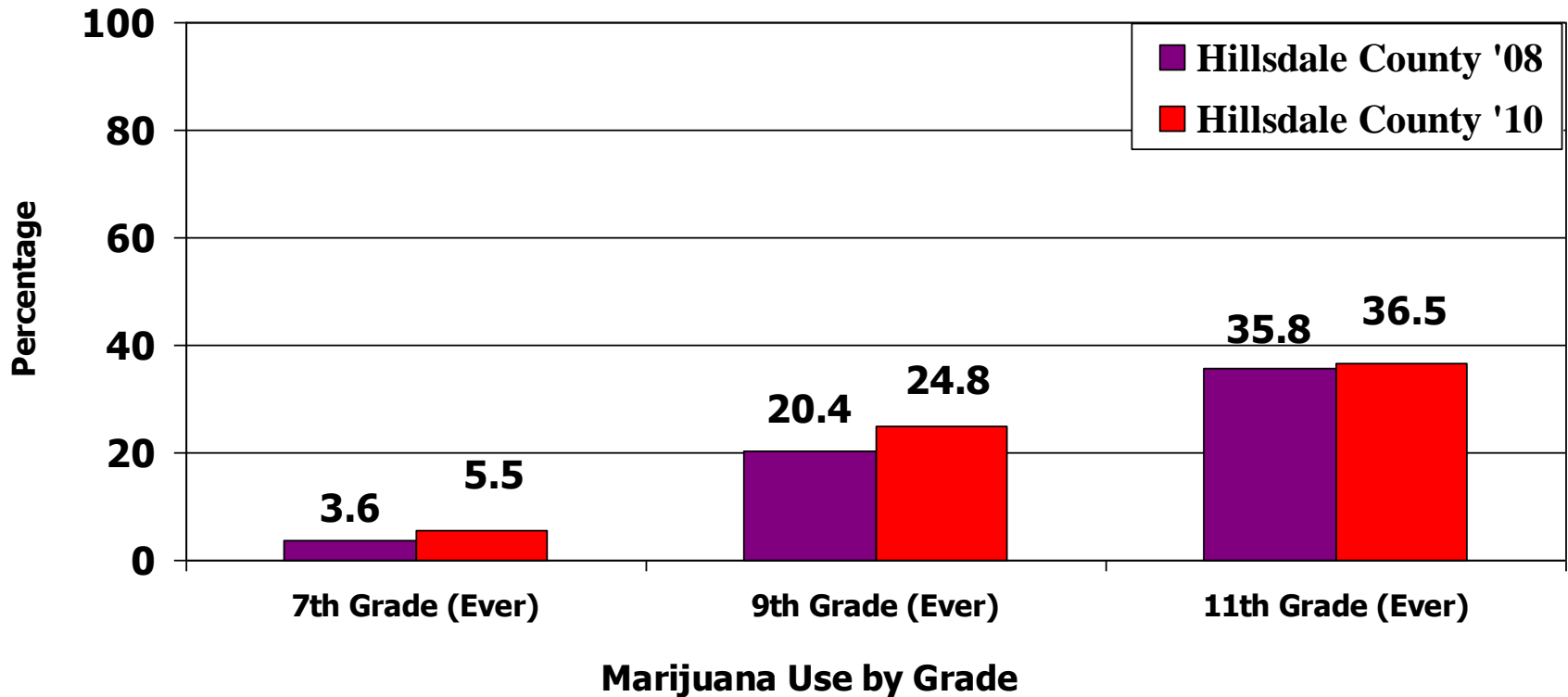

Marijuana Use - Lifetime

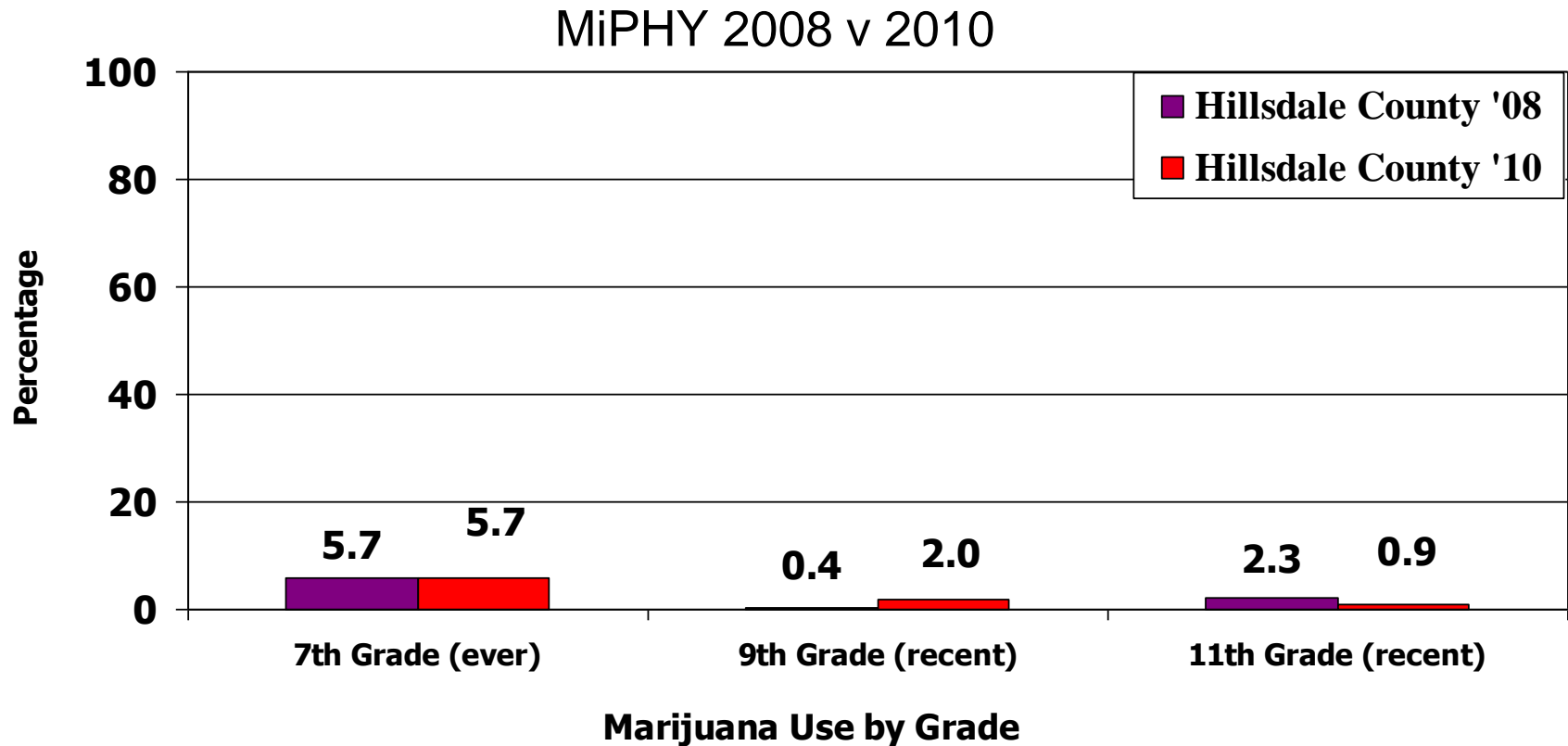

Cocaine Use – Past 30 Days

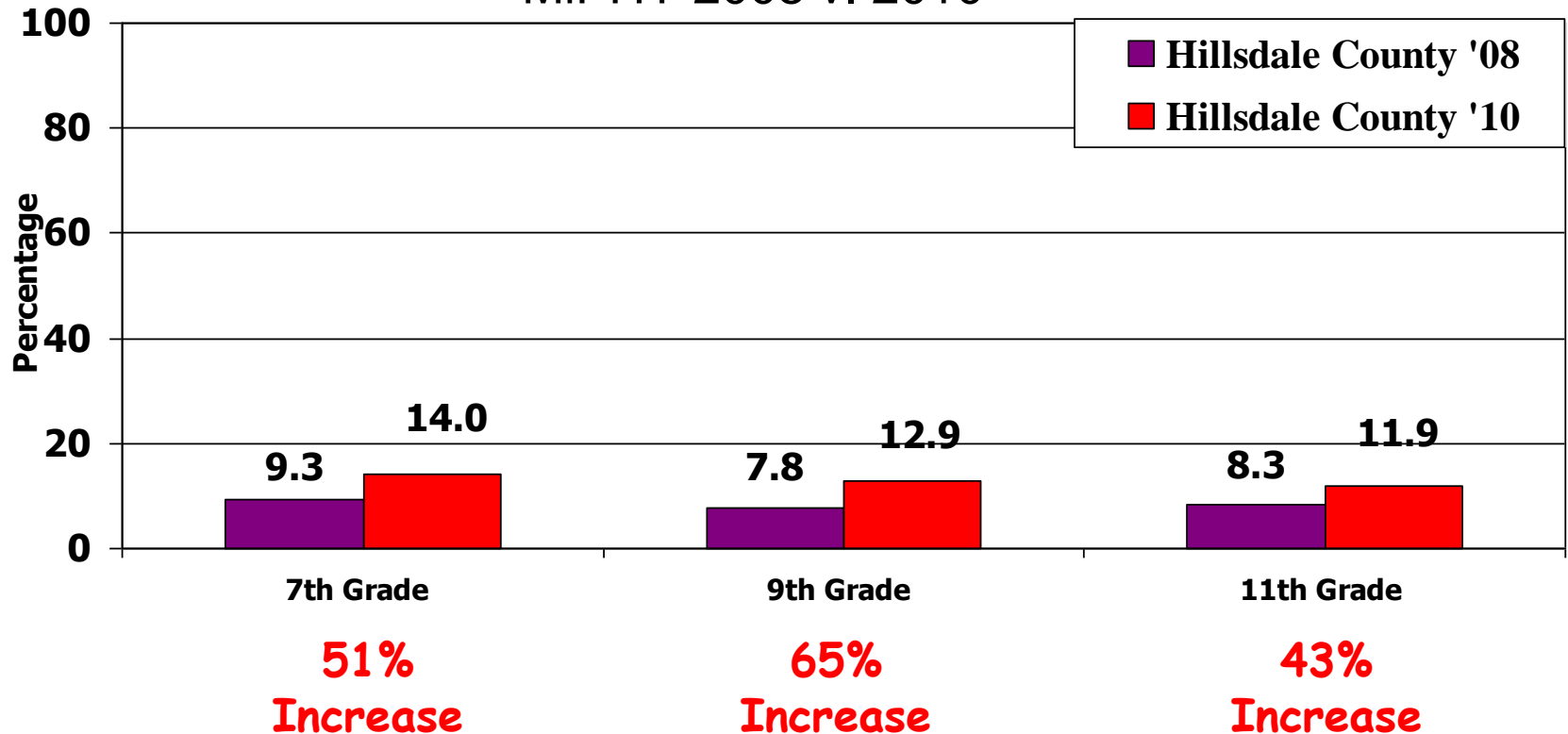

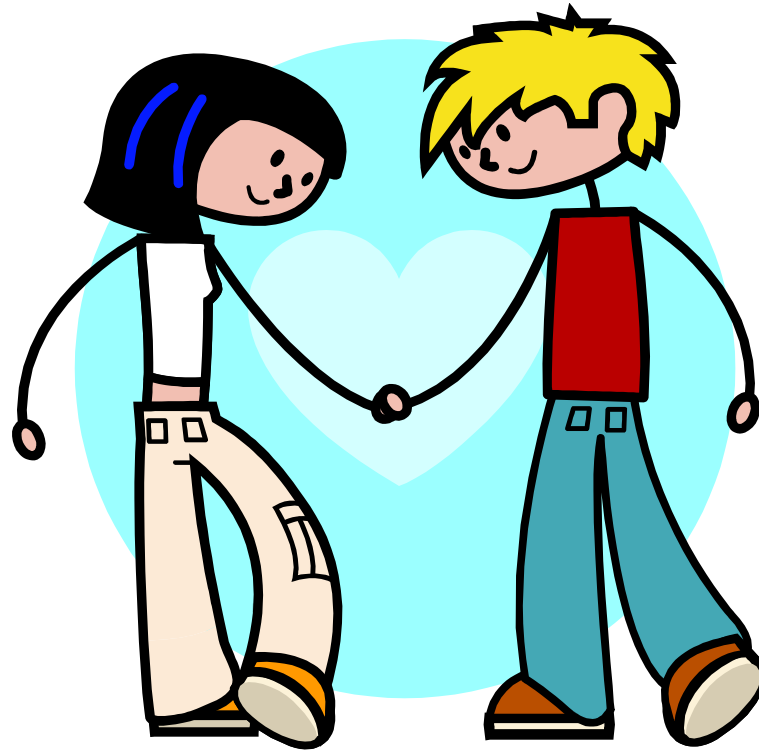
Prescription Painkillers

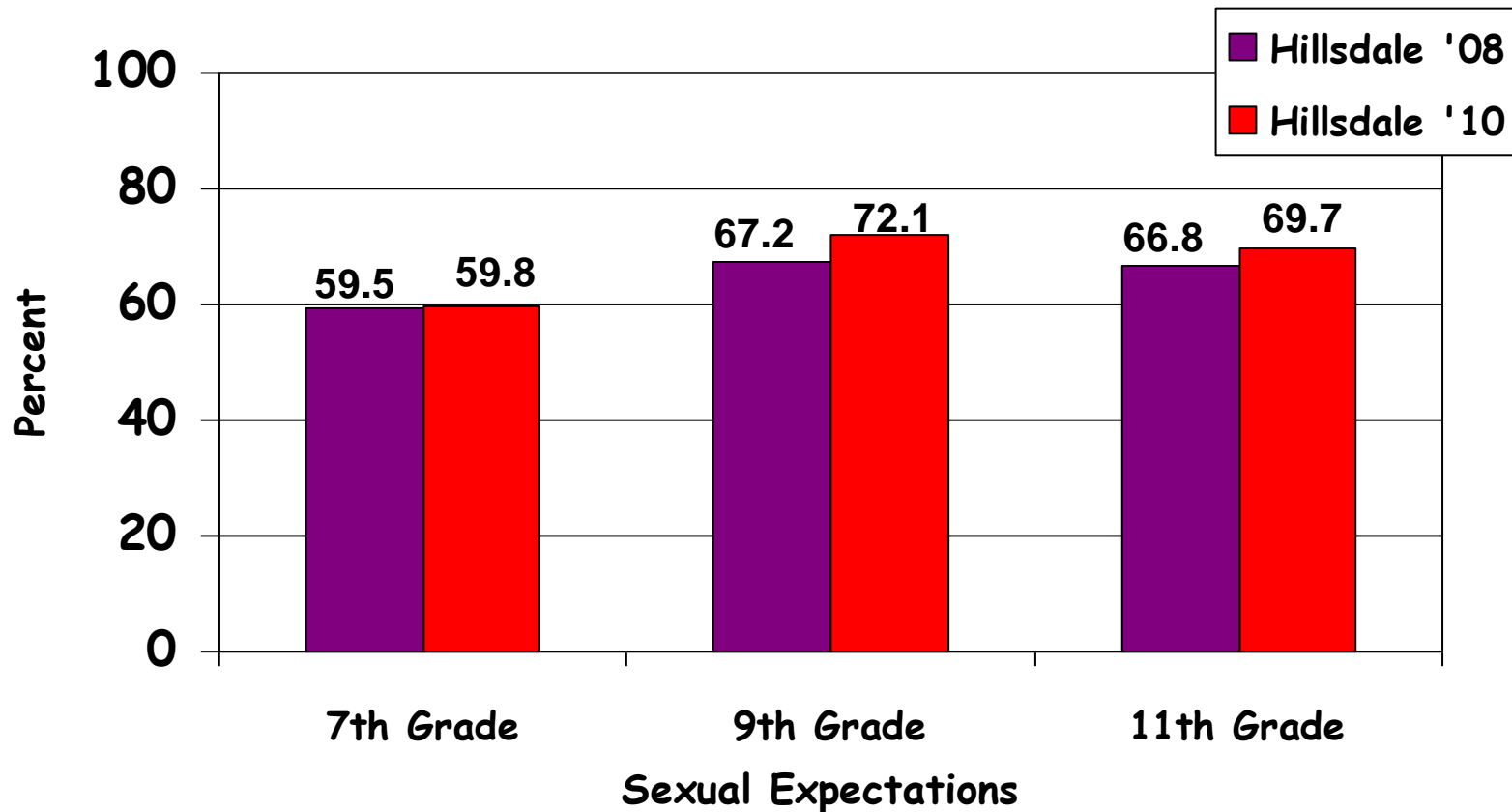

Percentage of Hillsdale Co. students who have **ever talked with their parents or other adults in their family about what they expected** them to do or not to do when it comes to sex

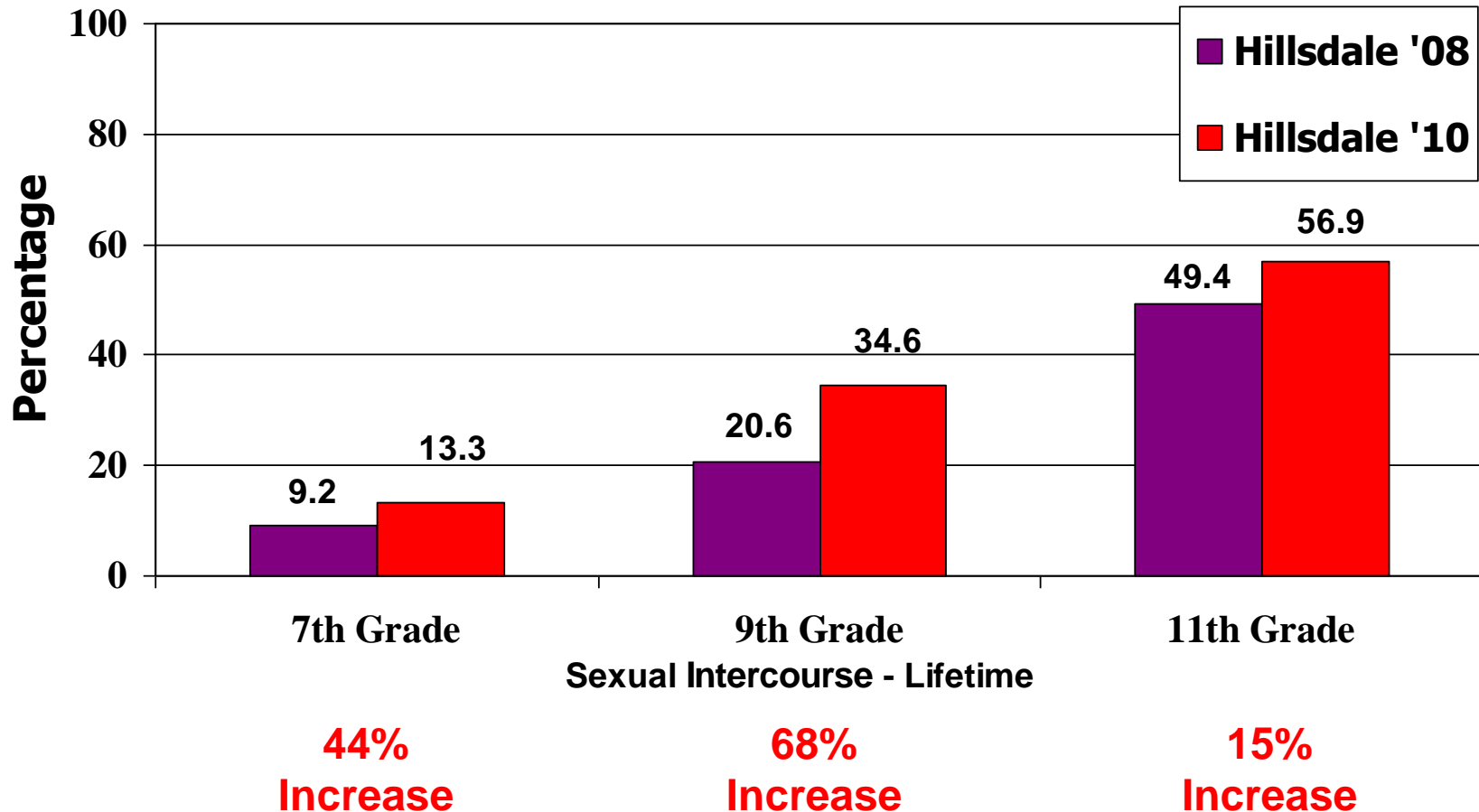

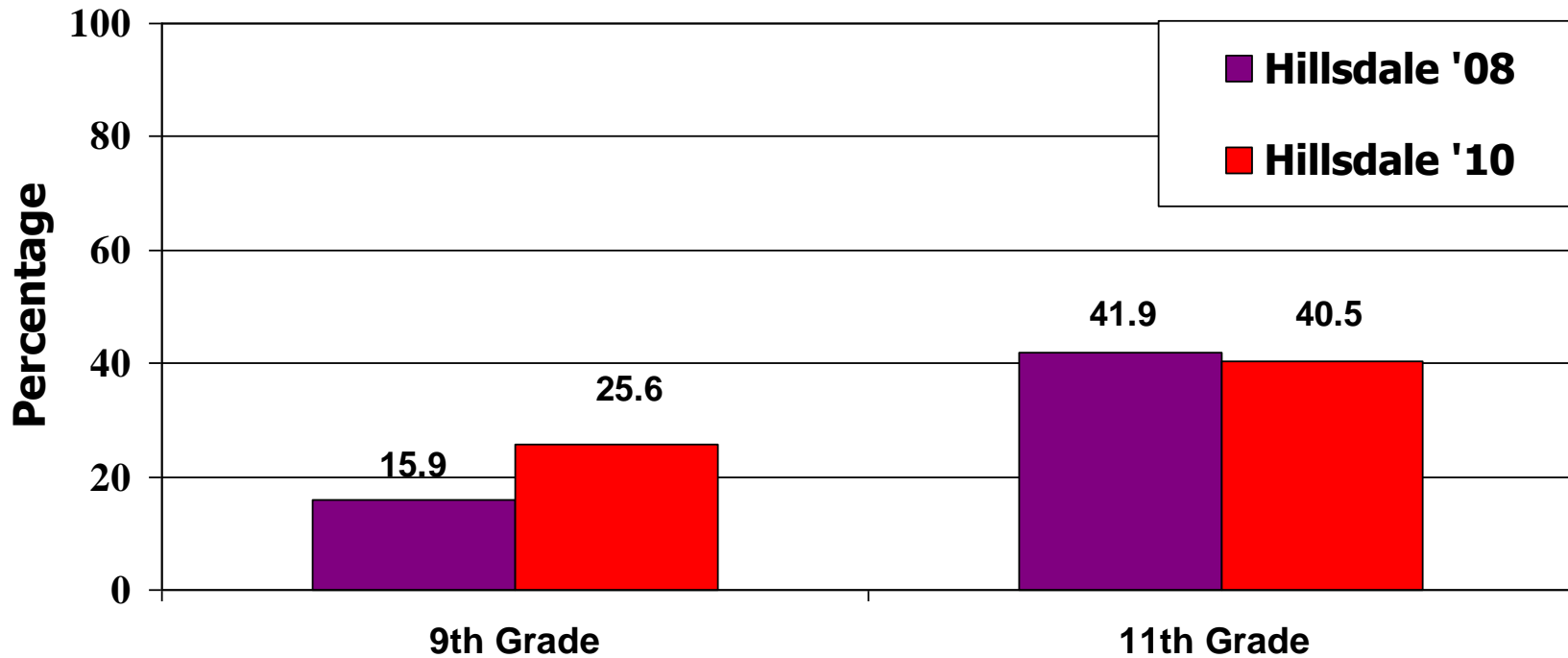
Percentage of students who ever had sexual intercourse (lifetime)

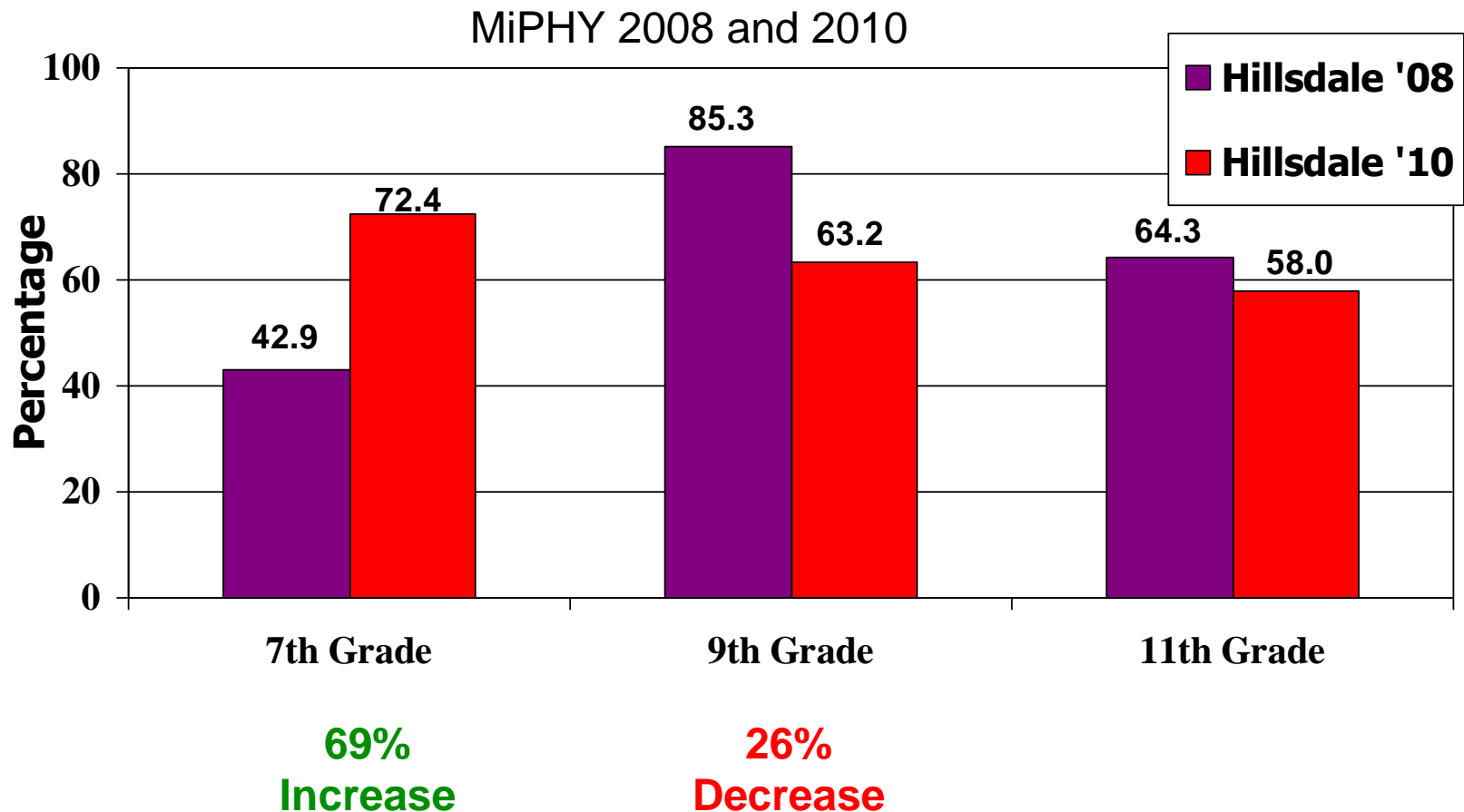

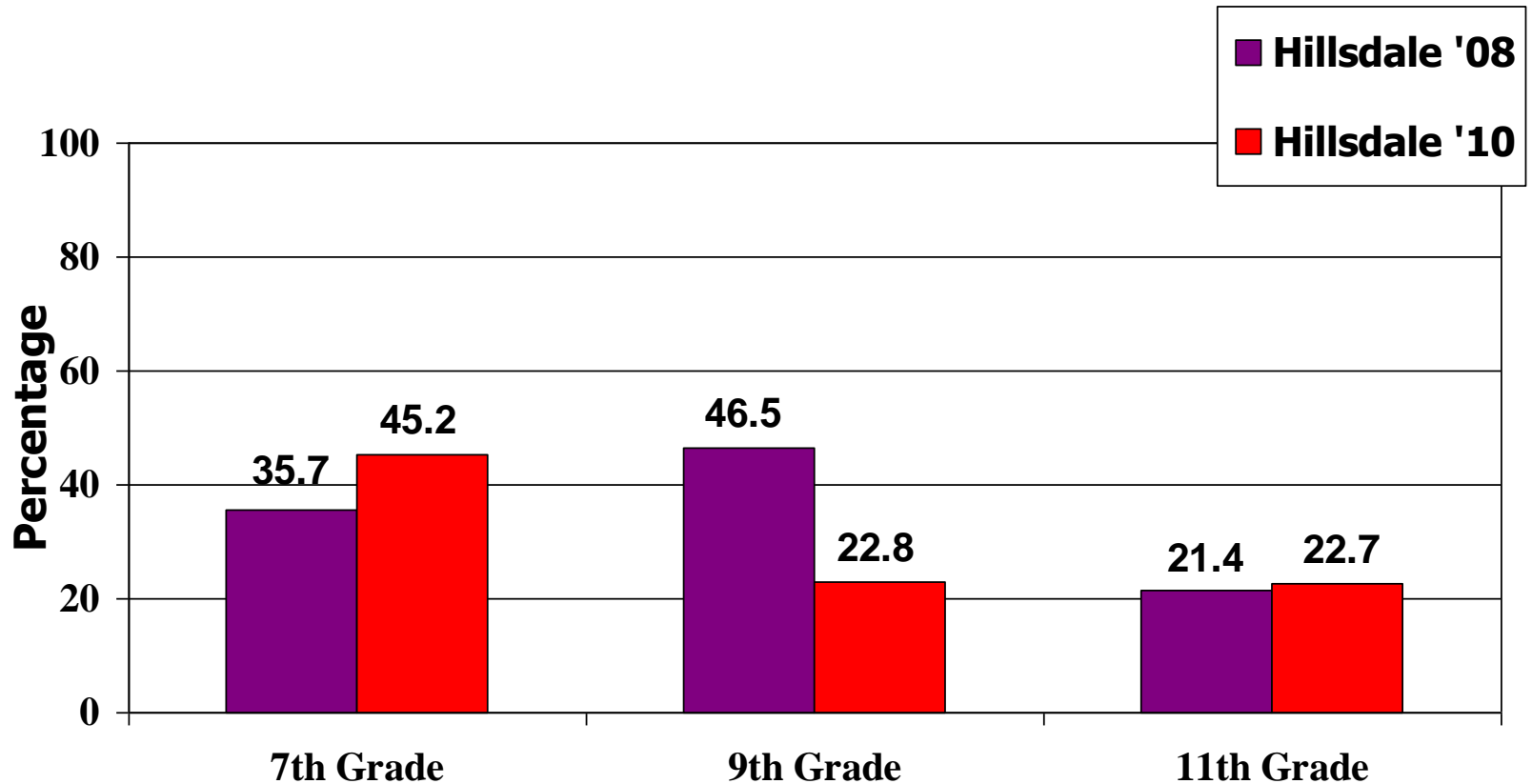
Among students who had sexual intercourse during the past three months, the percentage who used a condom during last sexual intercourse

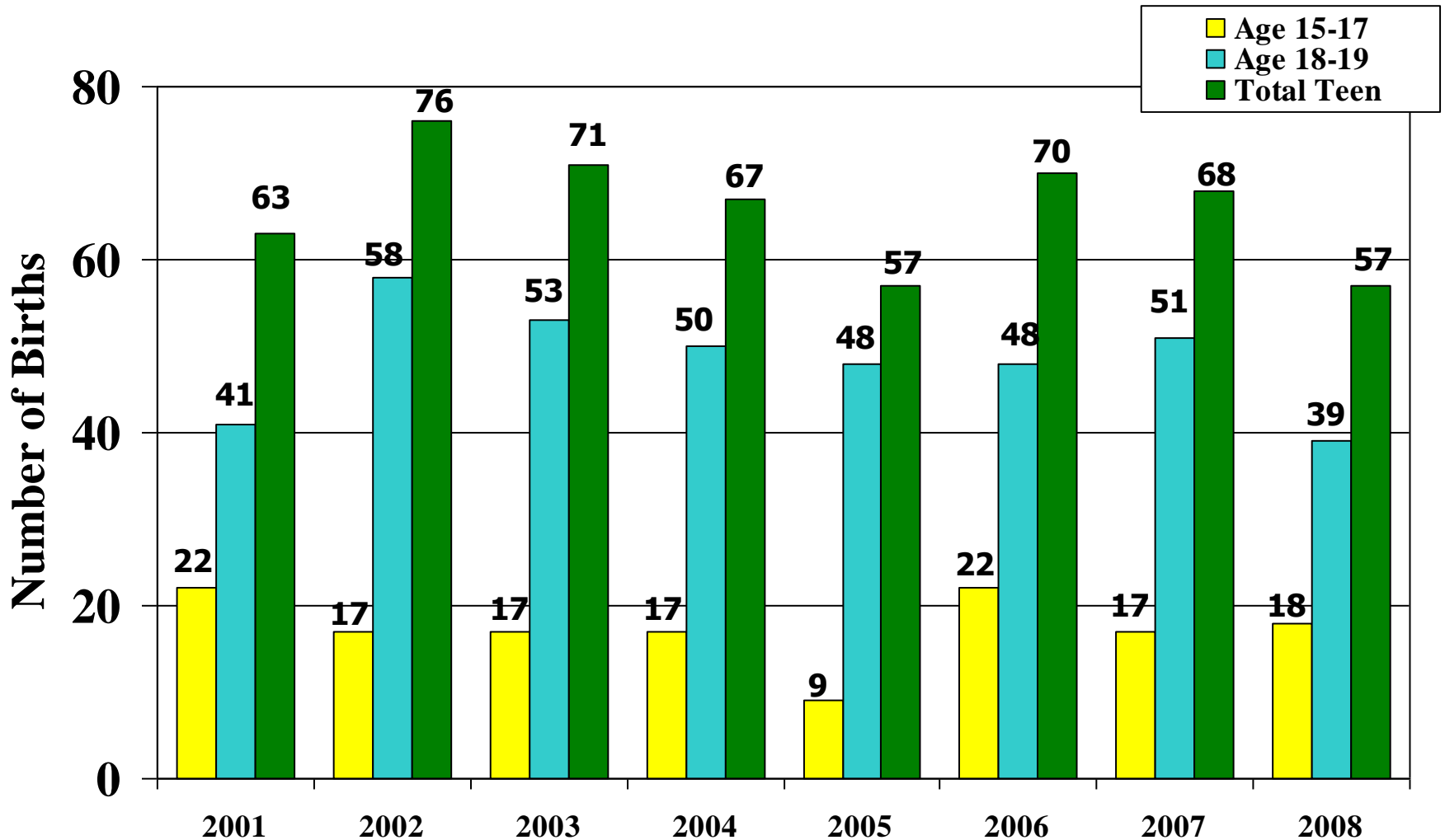

Teen births - Hillsdale County

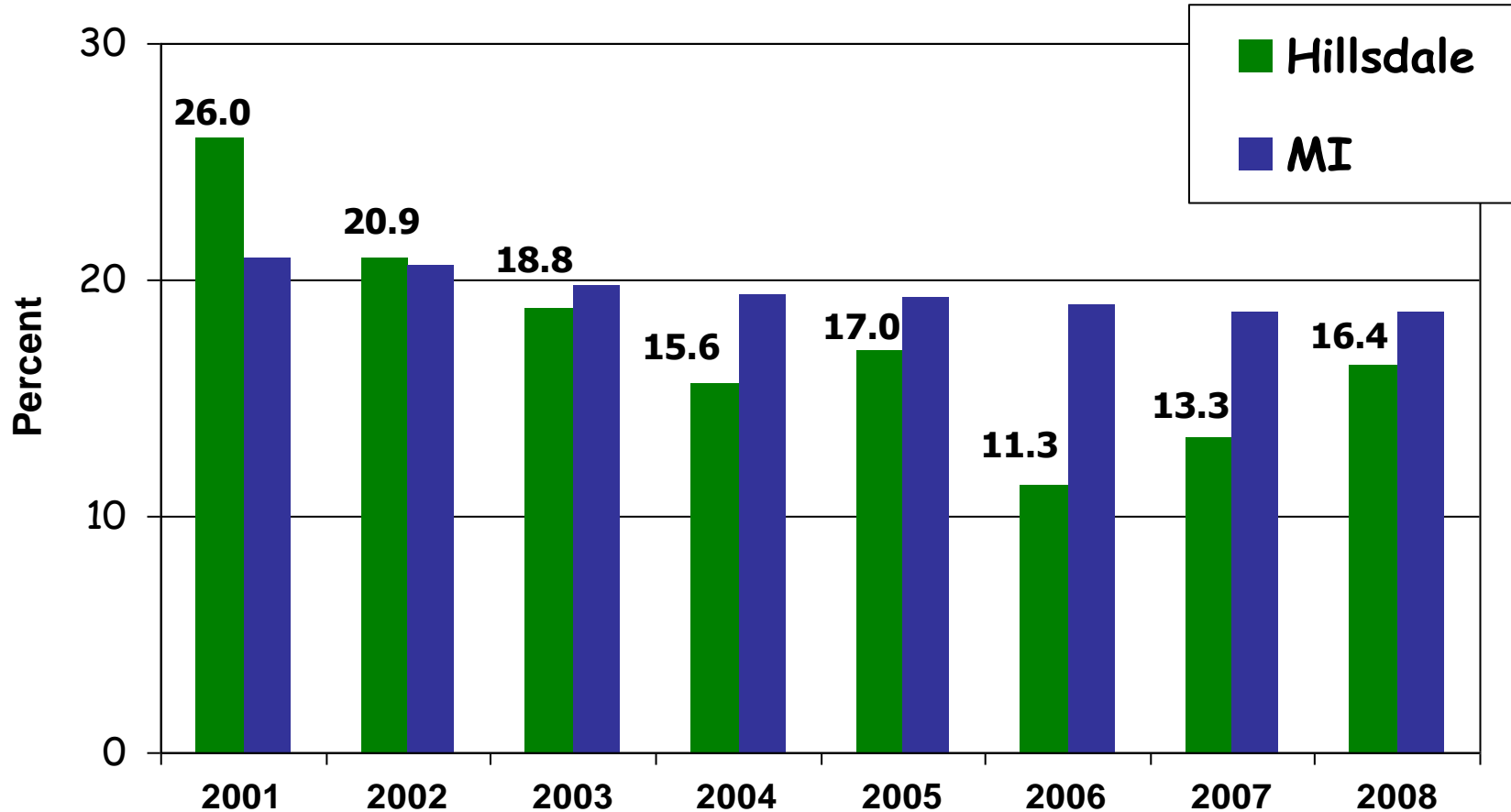

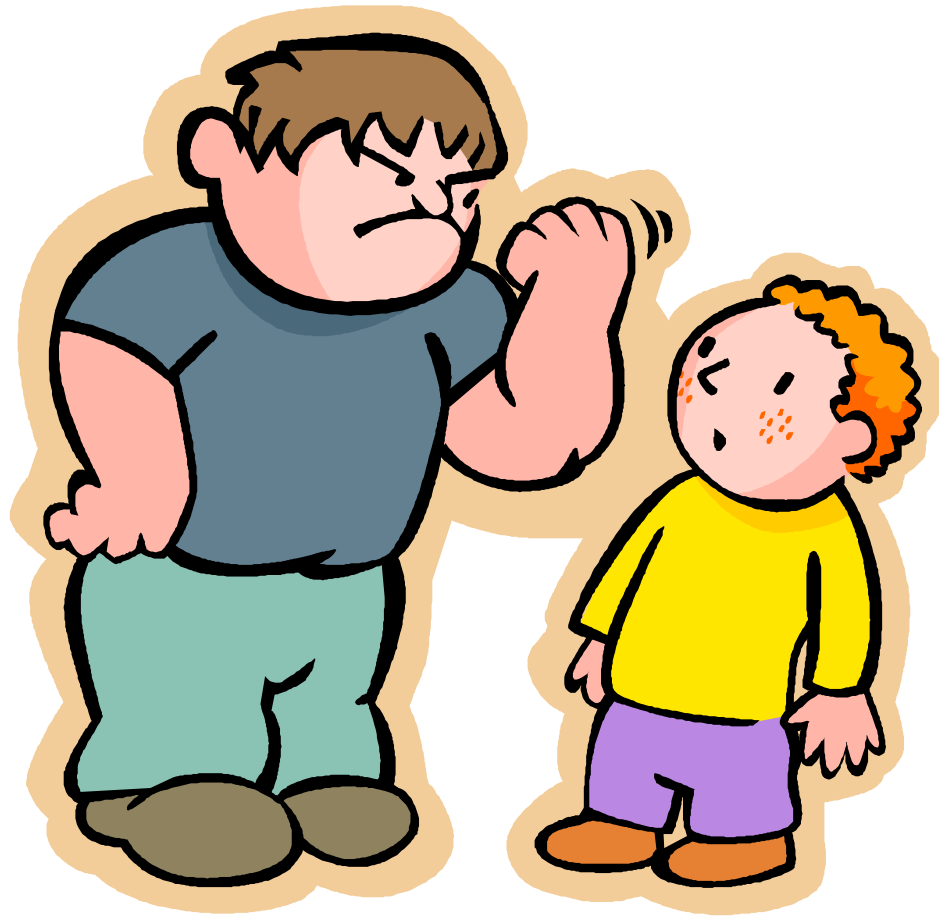
Costs of Teen Childbearing

Costs are associated with negative social and health outcomes for the children of teen parents, including poverty, educational attainment, involvement in the criminal justice and/or child welfare system and more.

In Michigan, teen childbearing cost taxpayers \$302 million in 2004.

- A child born to an unmarried teen who has not yet completed high school is **nine times more likely to grow up in poverty.**
- Children born to teen parents are **two times more likely to suffer abuse and/or neglect** than would occur if their mothers had delayed childbearing.
- **Less than half of mothers** who have a child before they turn 18 **ever graduate high school.**
- **More than 98 percent of mothers** who have children before 18 **do not have a college degree by age 30.**

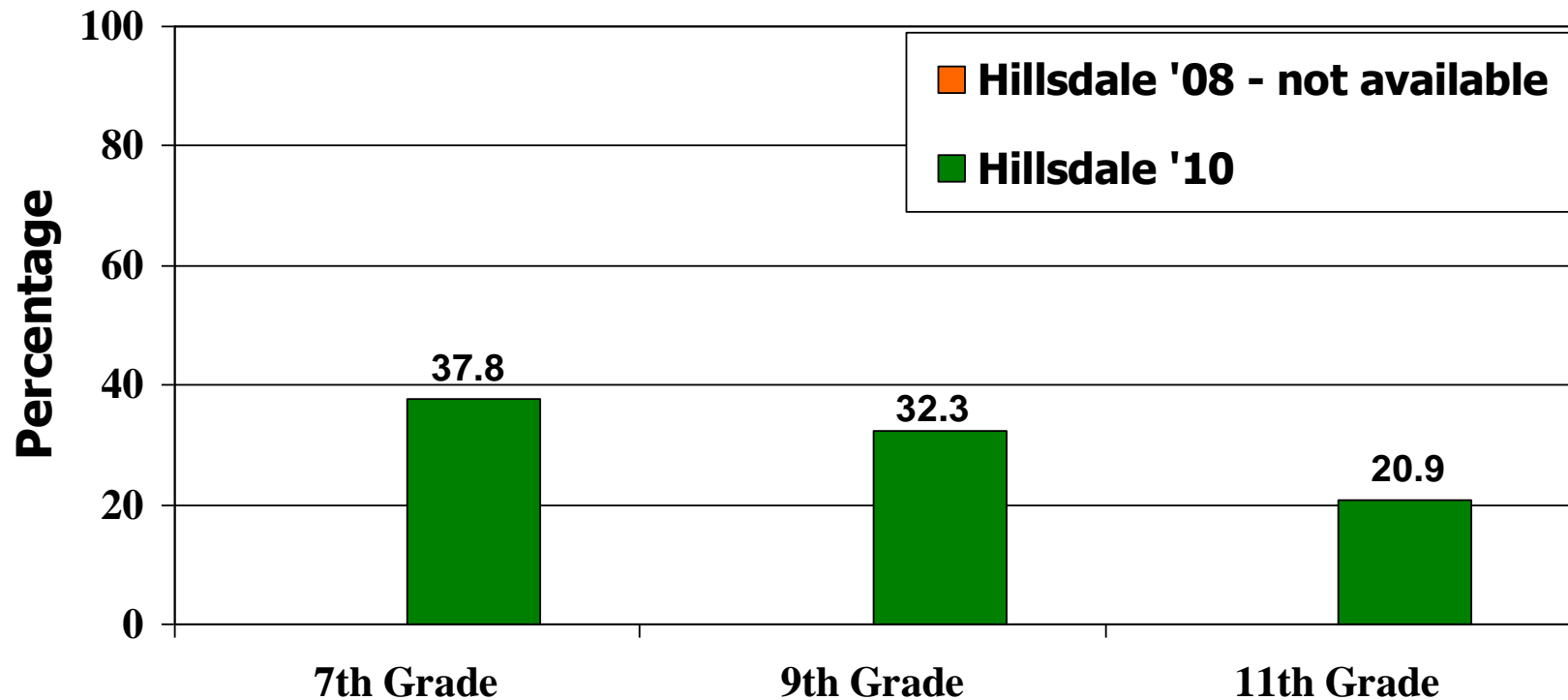

Percentage of students who have **ever been bullied** on school property – 2010

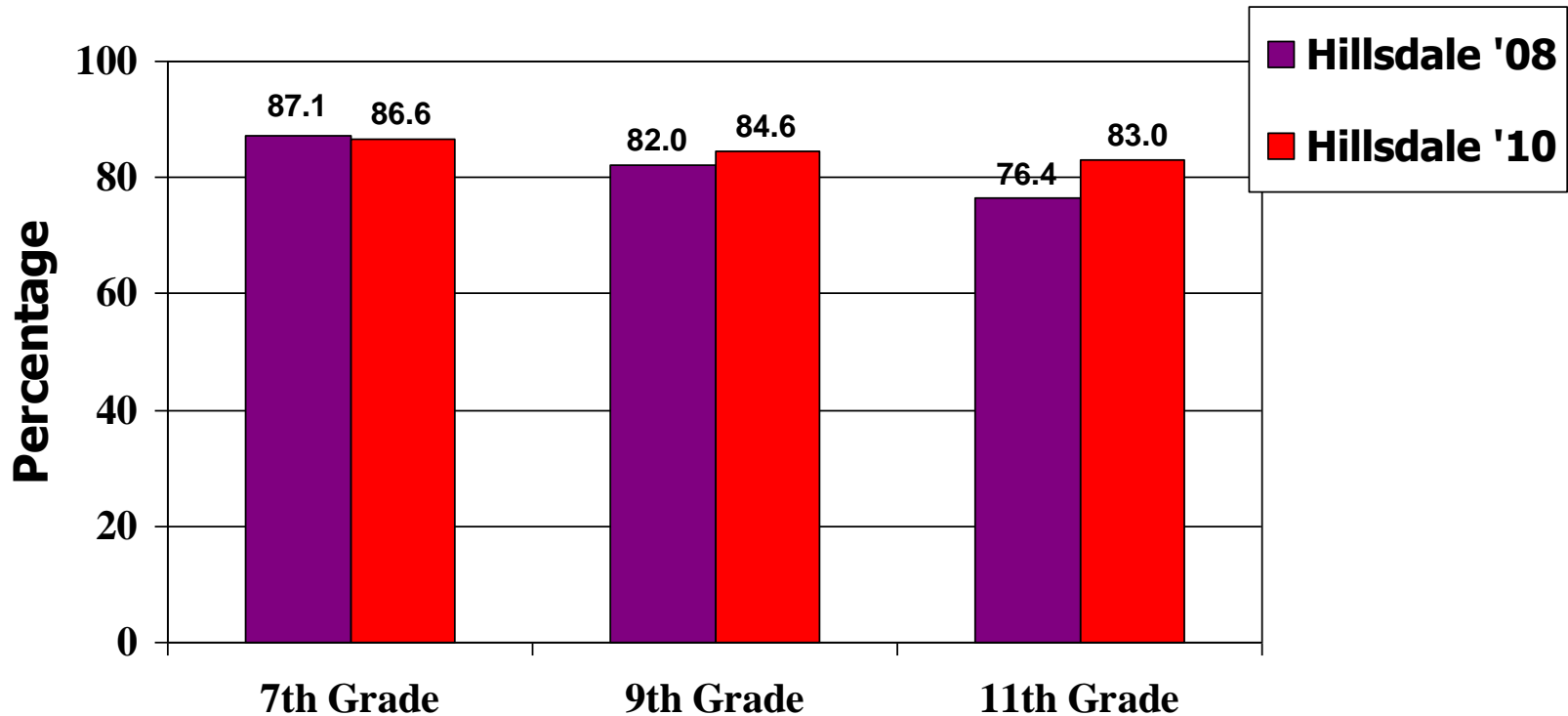

Percentage of students who have seen students get **pushed, hit, or punched** one or more times during the past 12 months

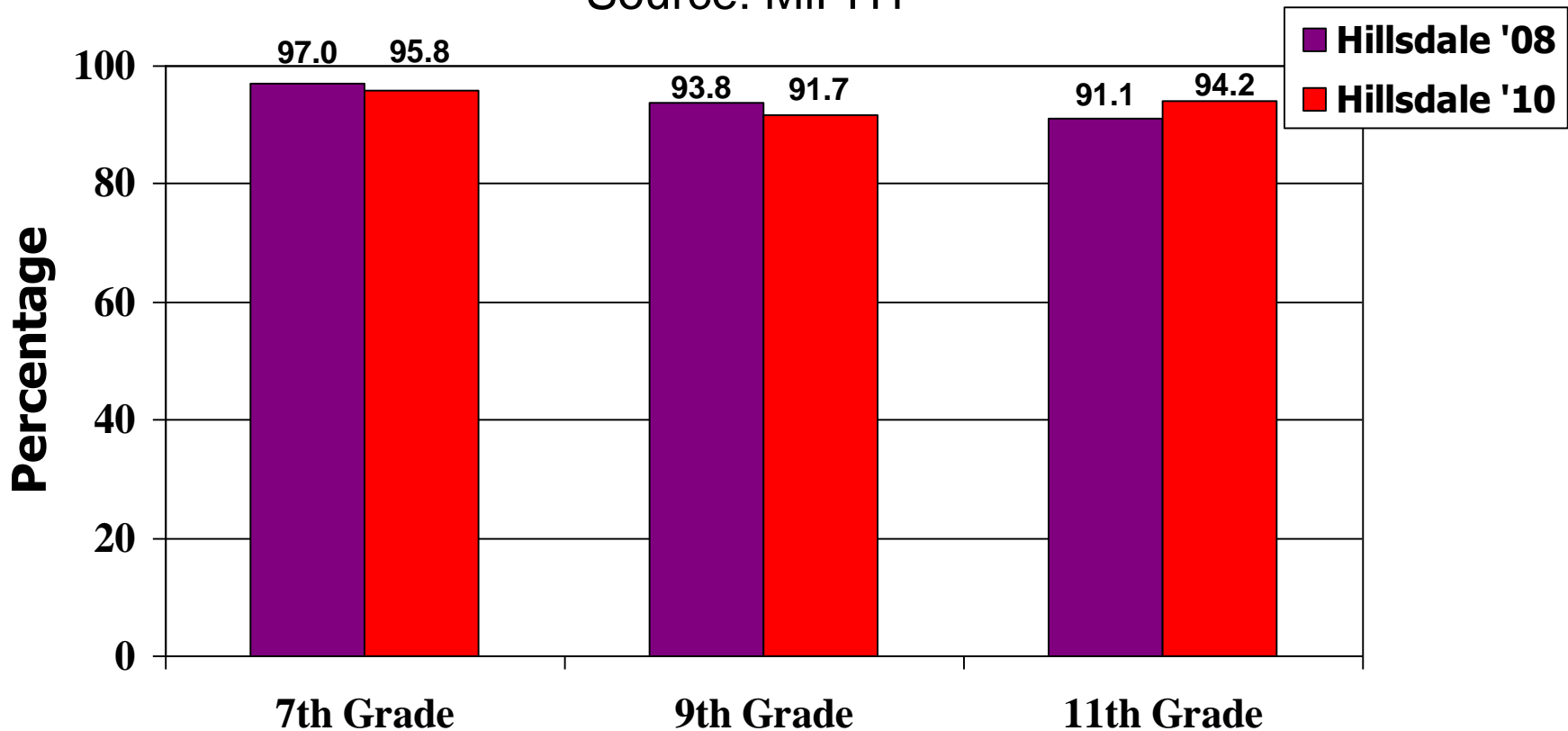

Percentage of students who have heard students **get called mean names or get “put down”** one or more times during the past 12 months.

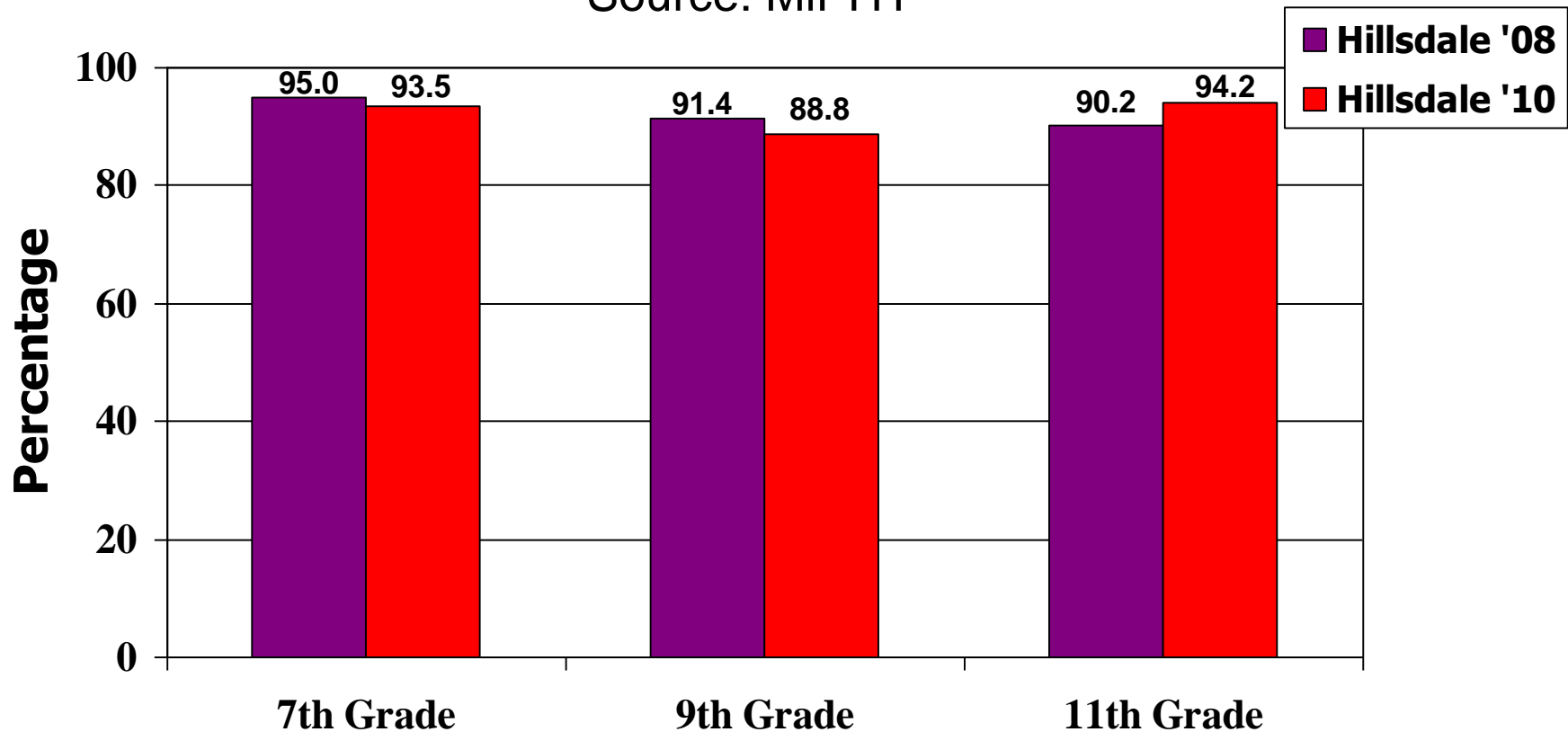

Percentage of students who have heard **rumors or lies** being spread about other students one or more times during the past 12 months.

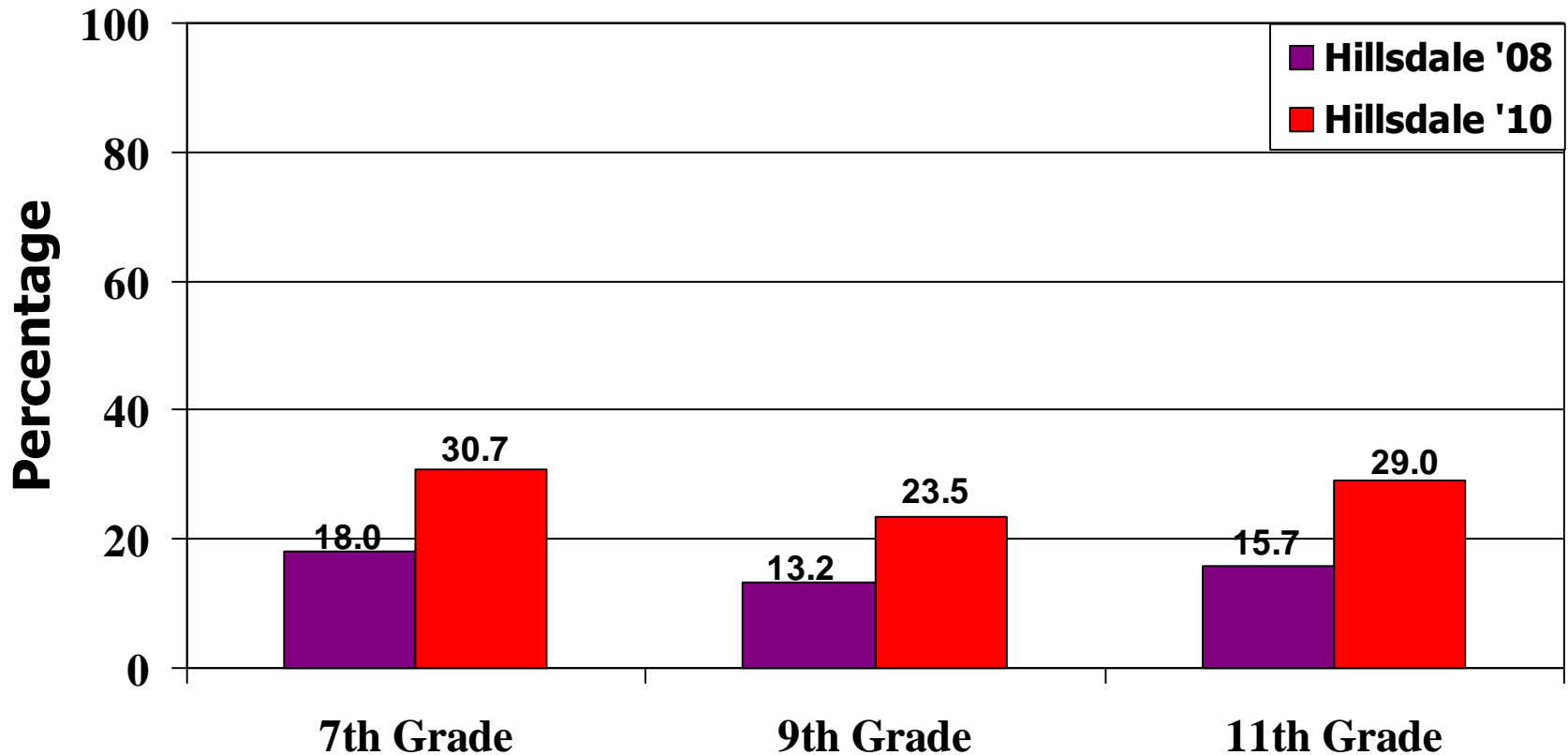

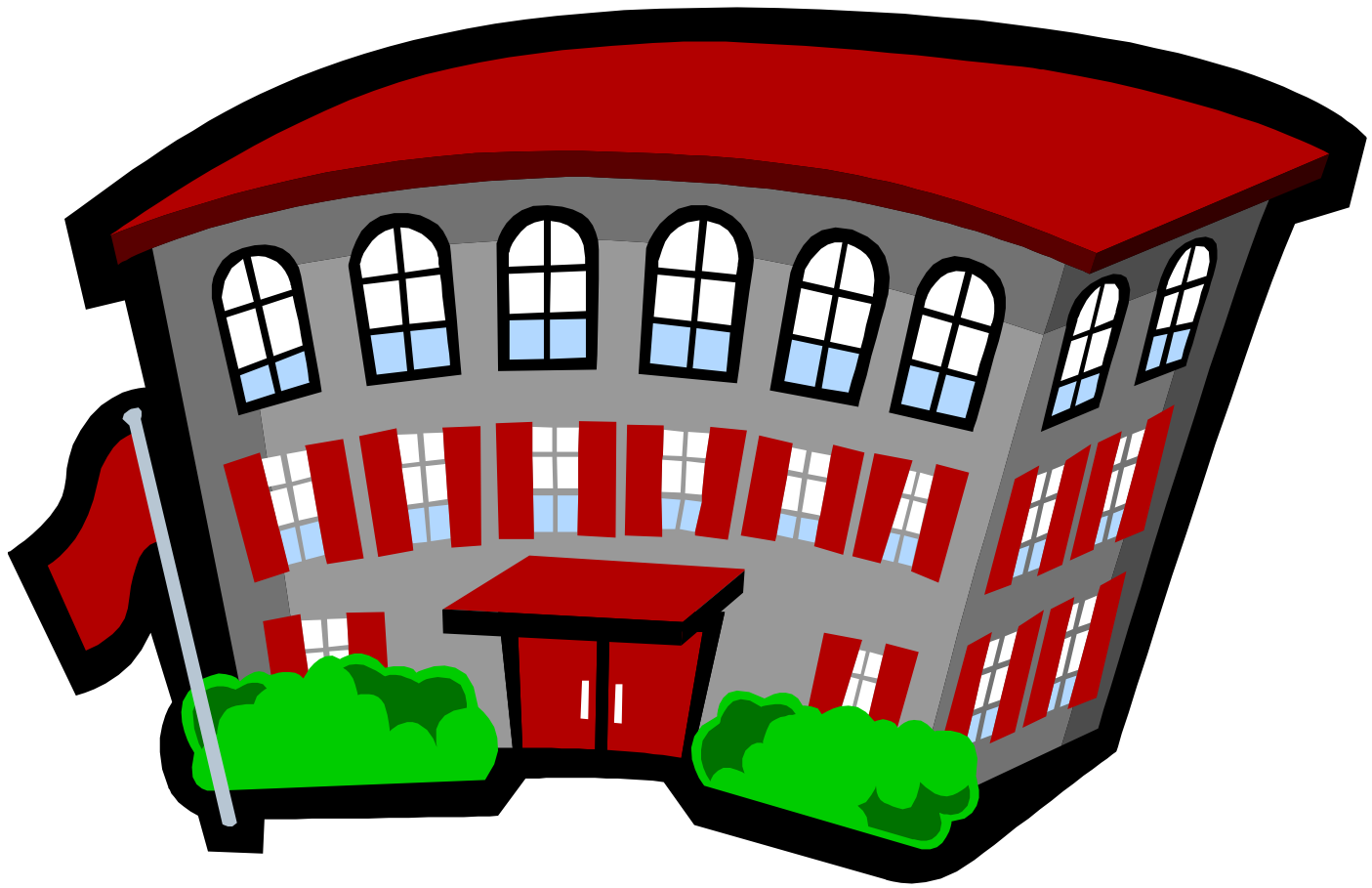

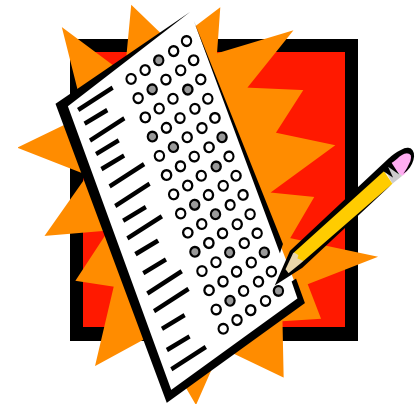

MEAP Results

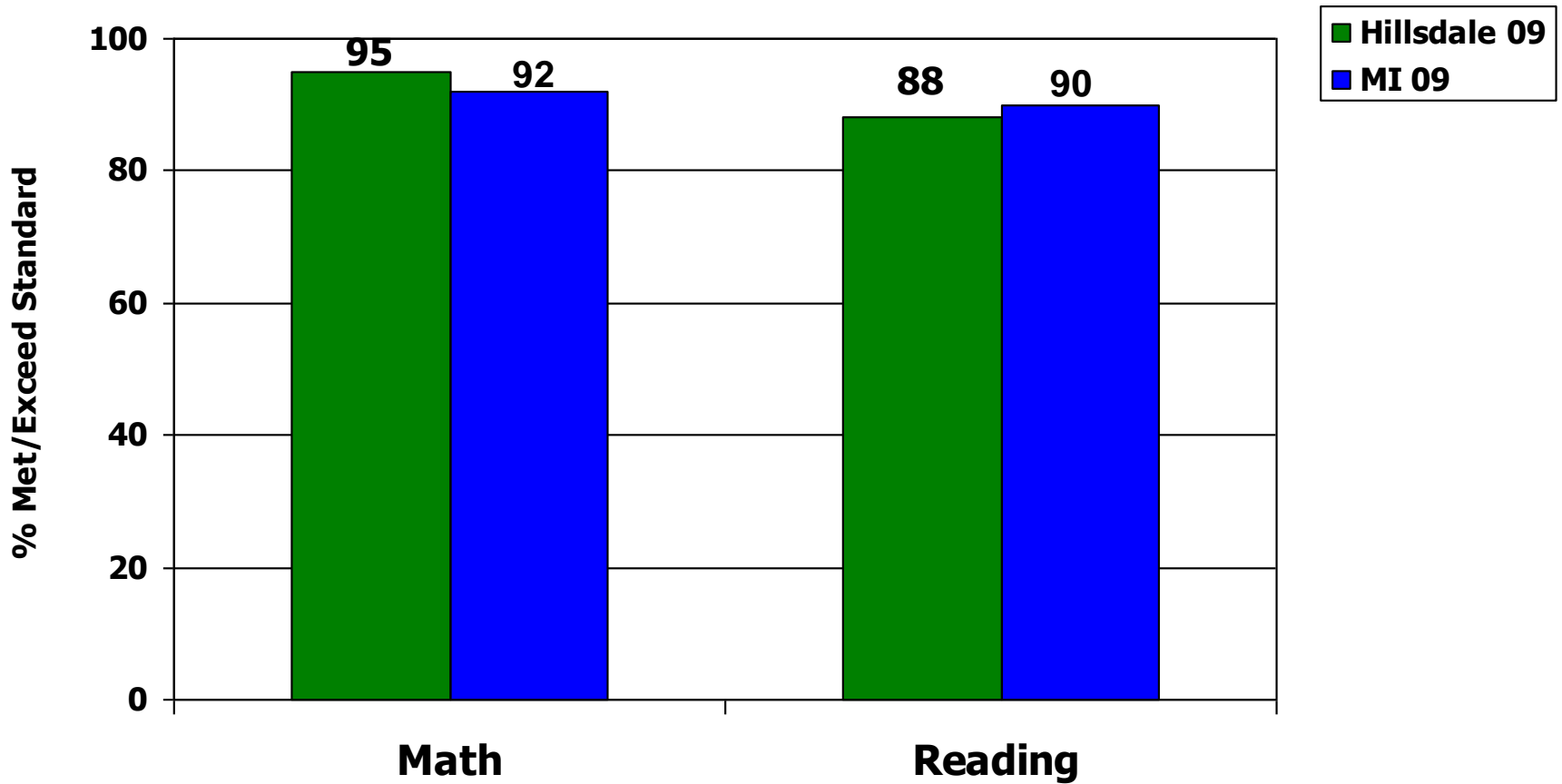
Due to changes in the MEAP nearly every year, trend data is merely impossible.

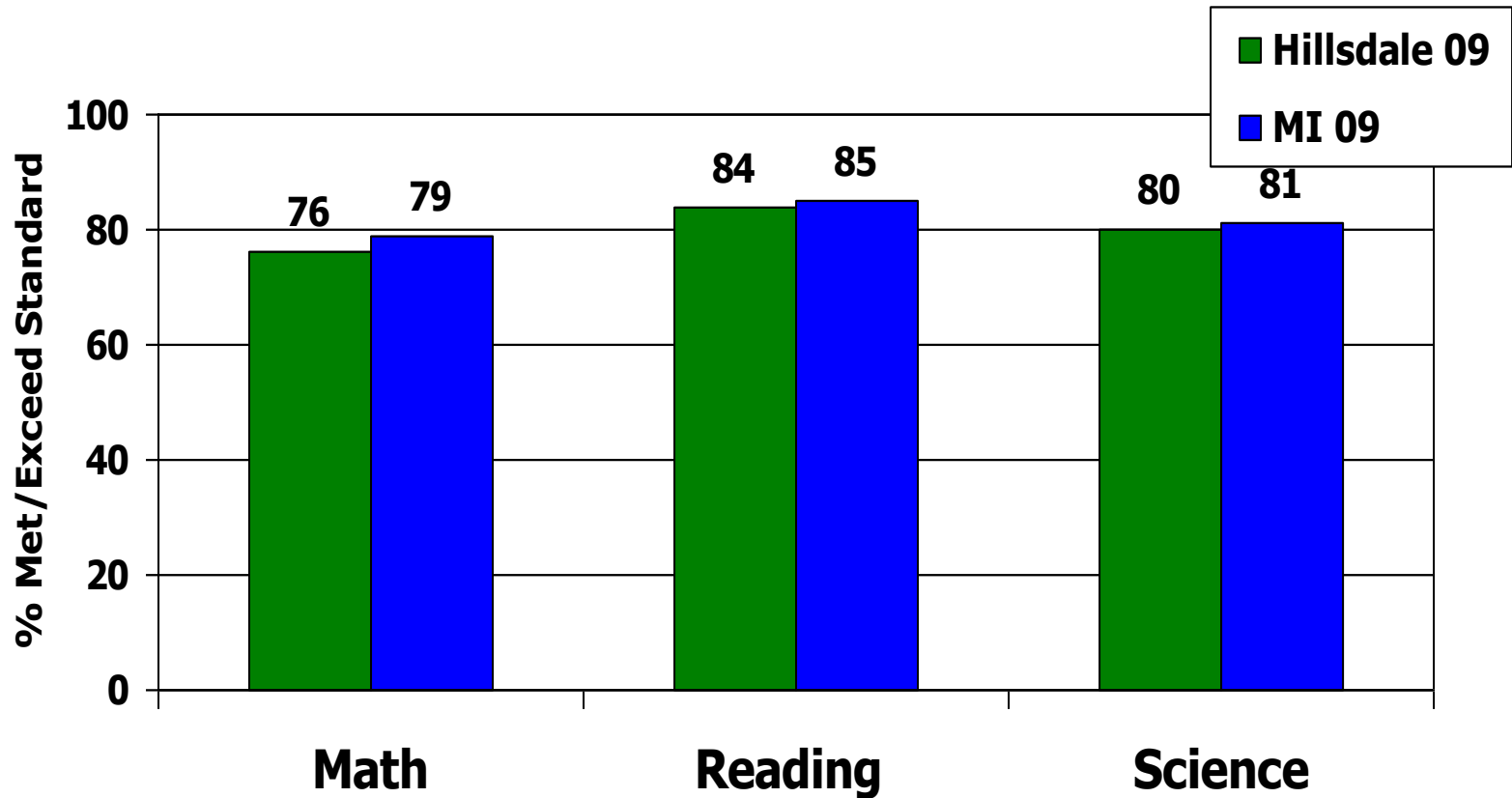
3rd Grade MEAP scores Hillsdale Co. and MI – 2009

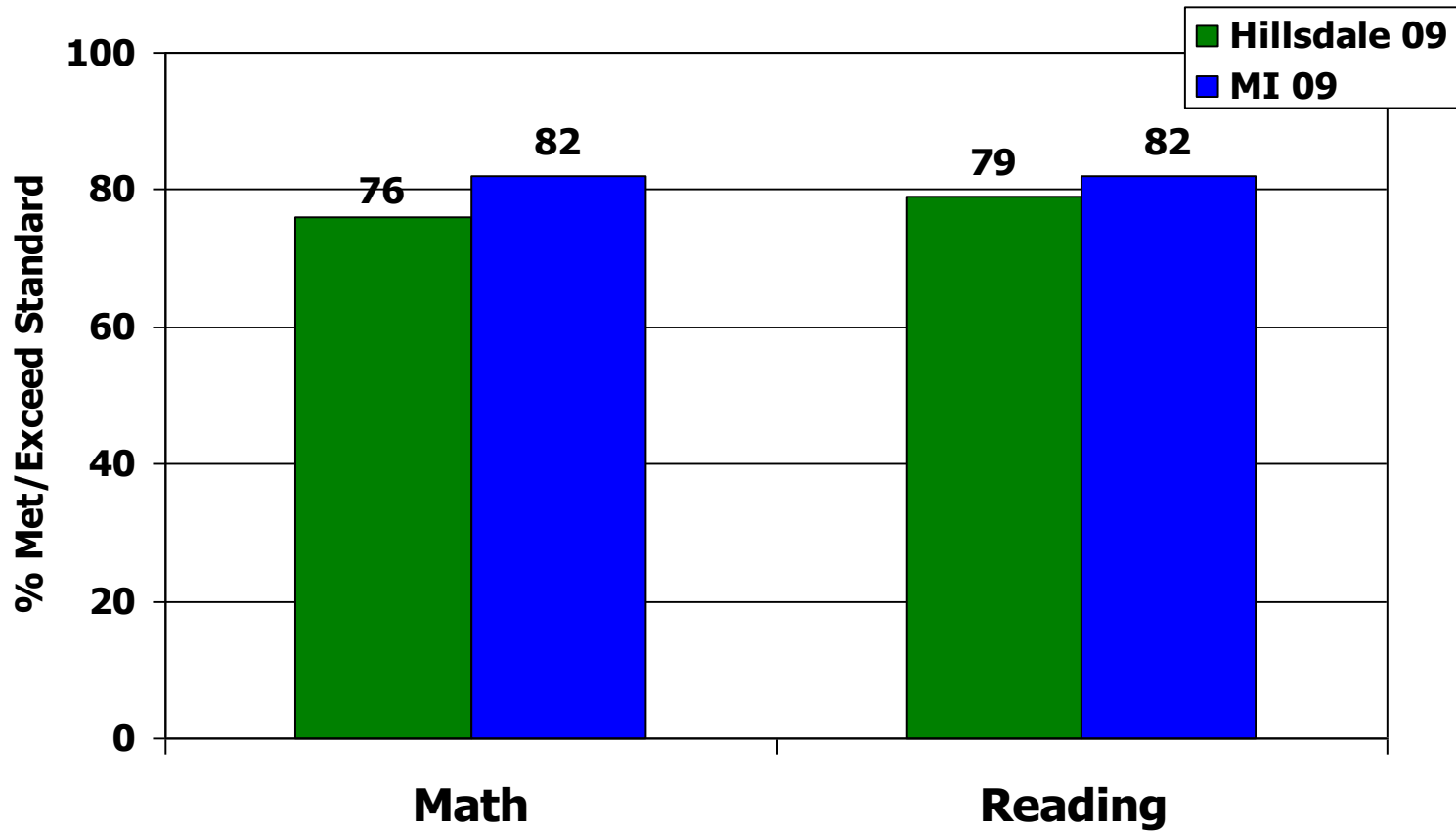
5th Grade MEAP scores Hillsdale Co. and MI – 2009

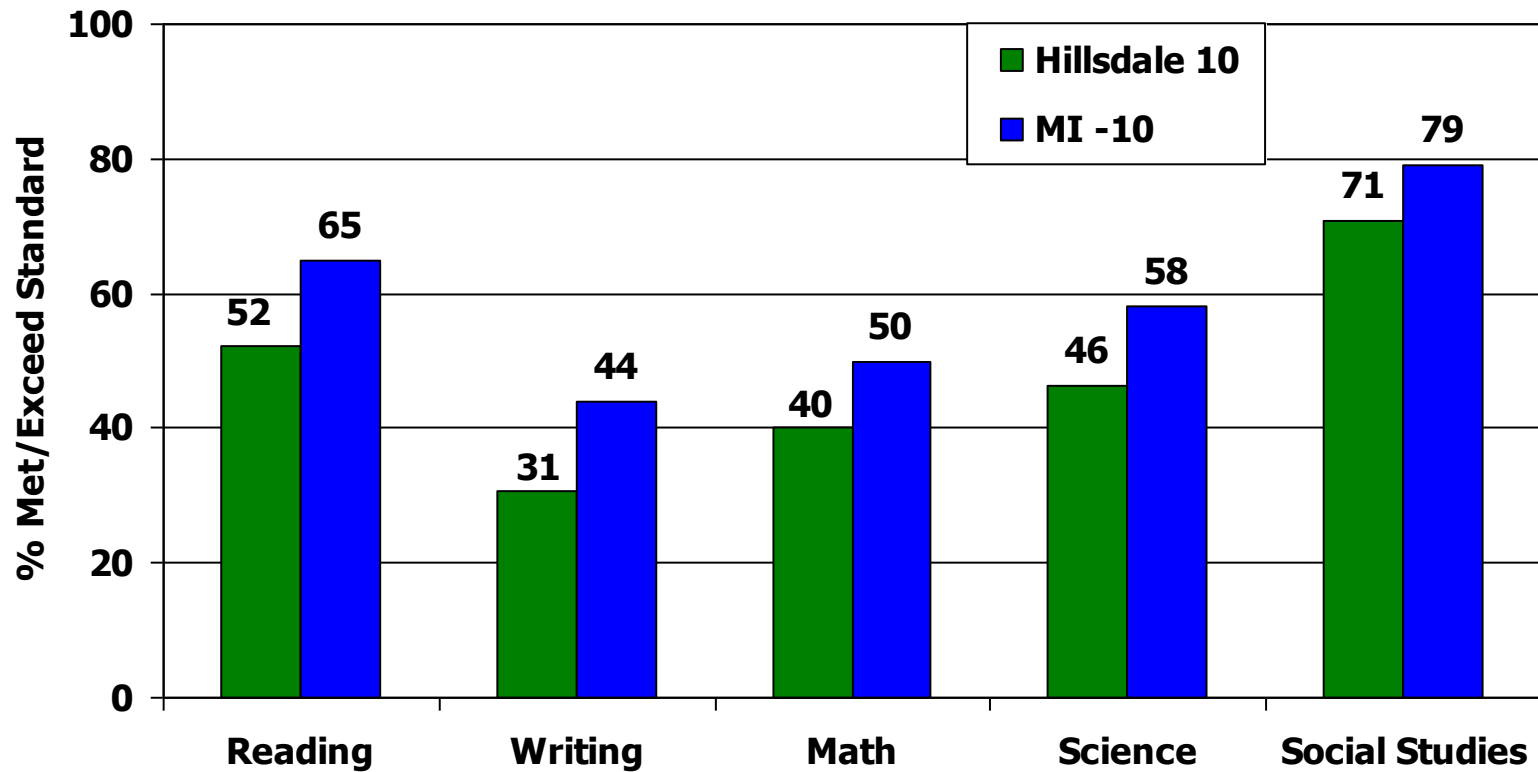
7th Grade MEAP scores Hillsdale Co. and MI – 2009

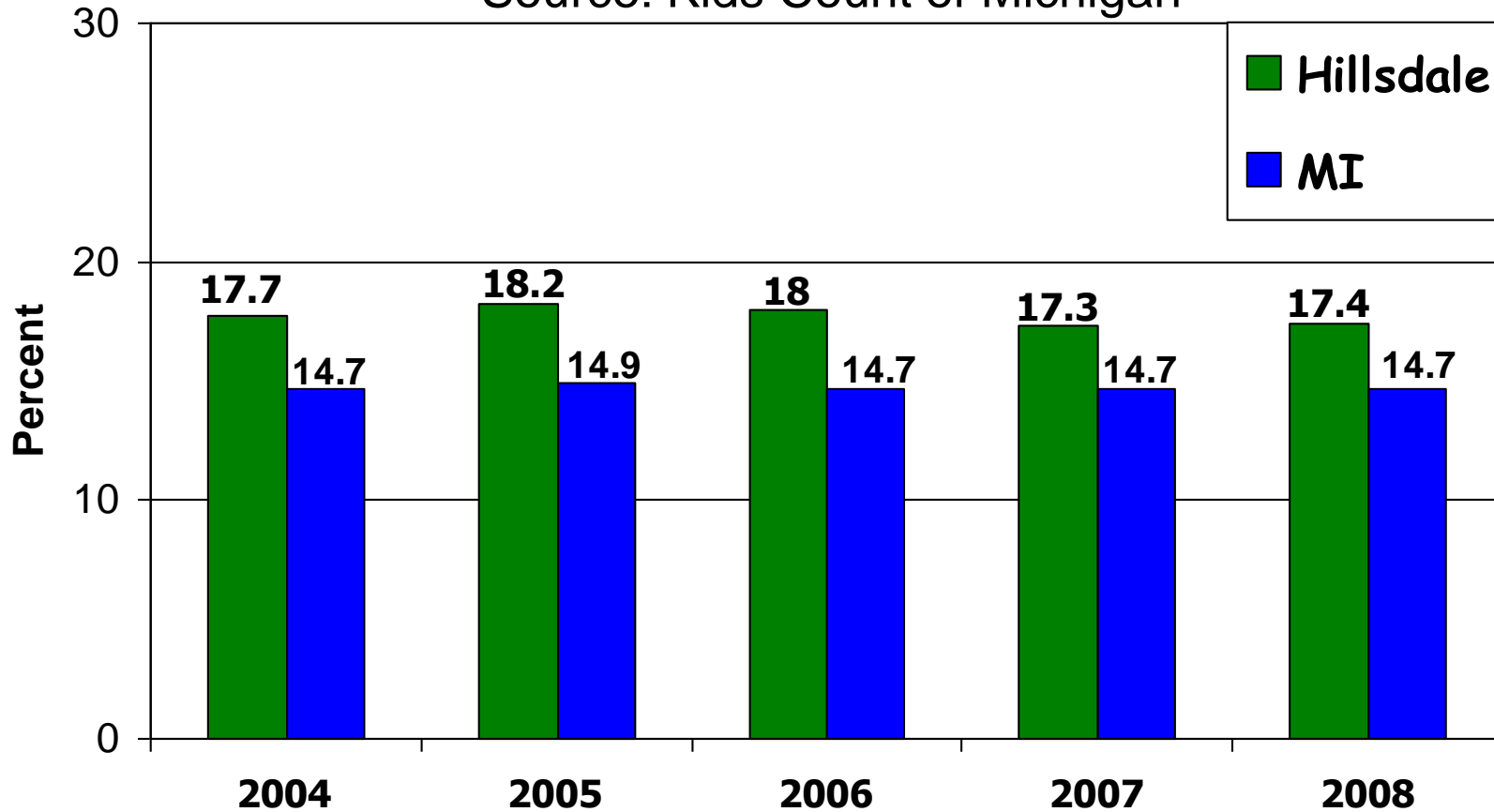


Percent in Special Education Age 0-26

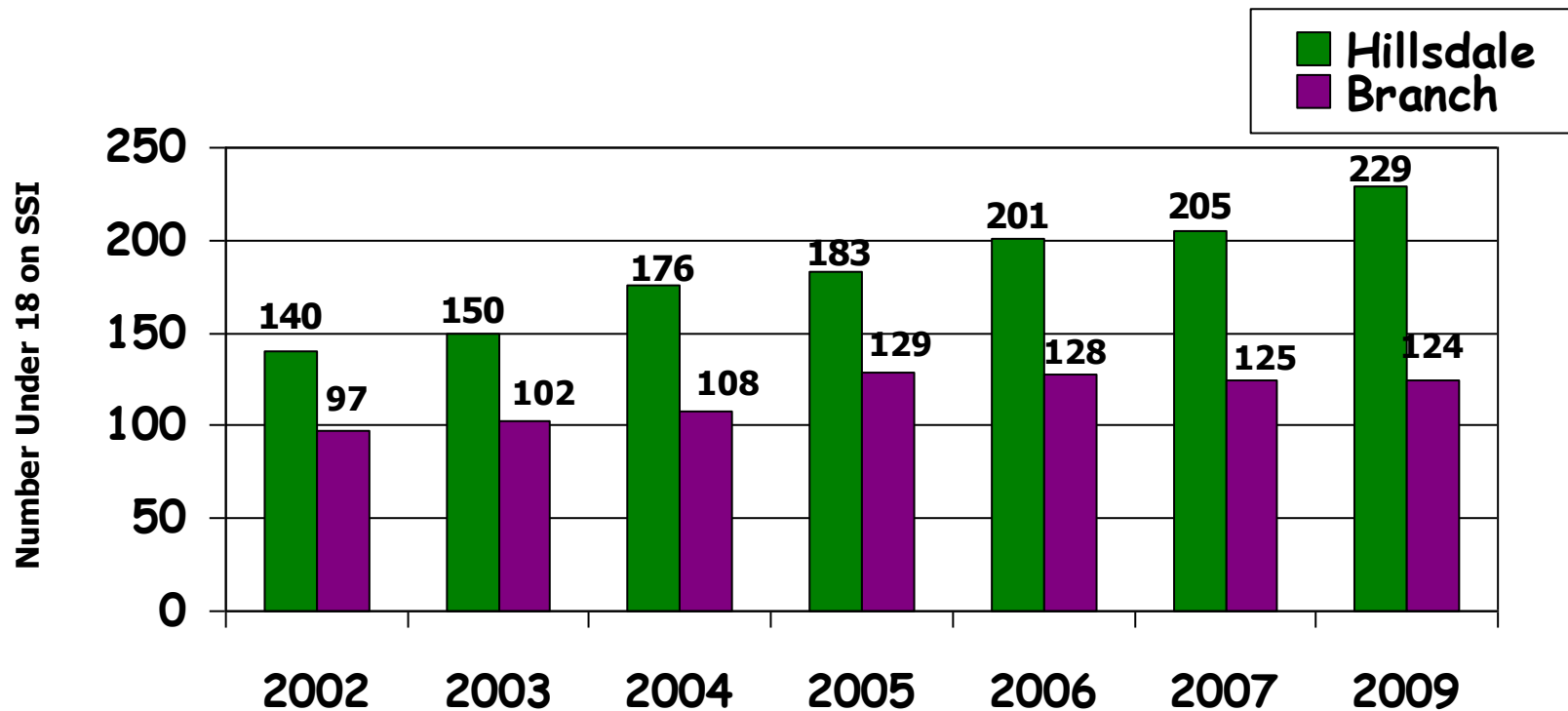


Number of Children Under Age 18 On SSI

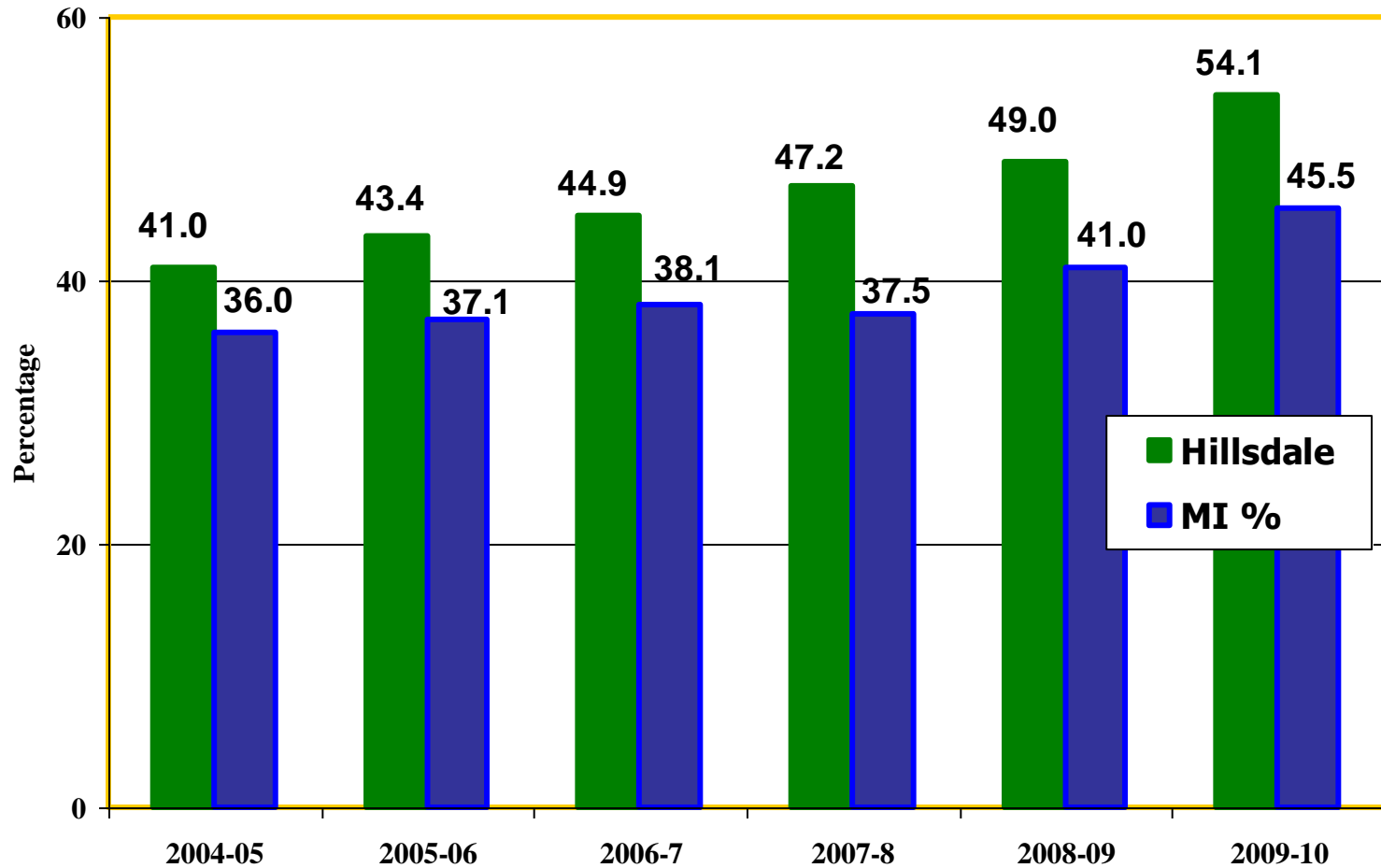

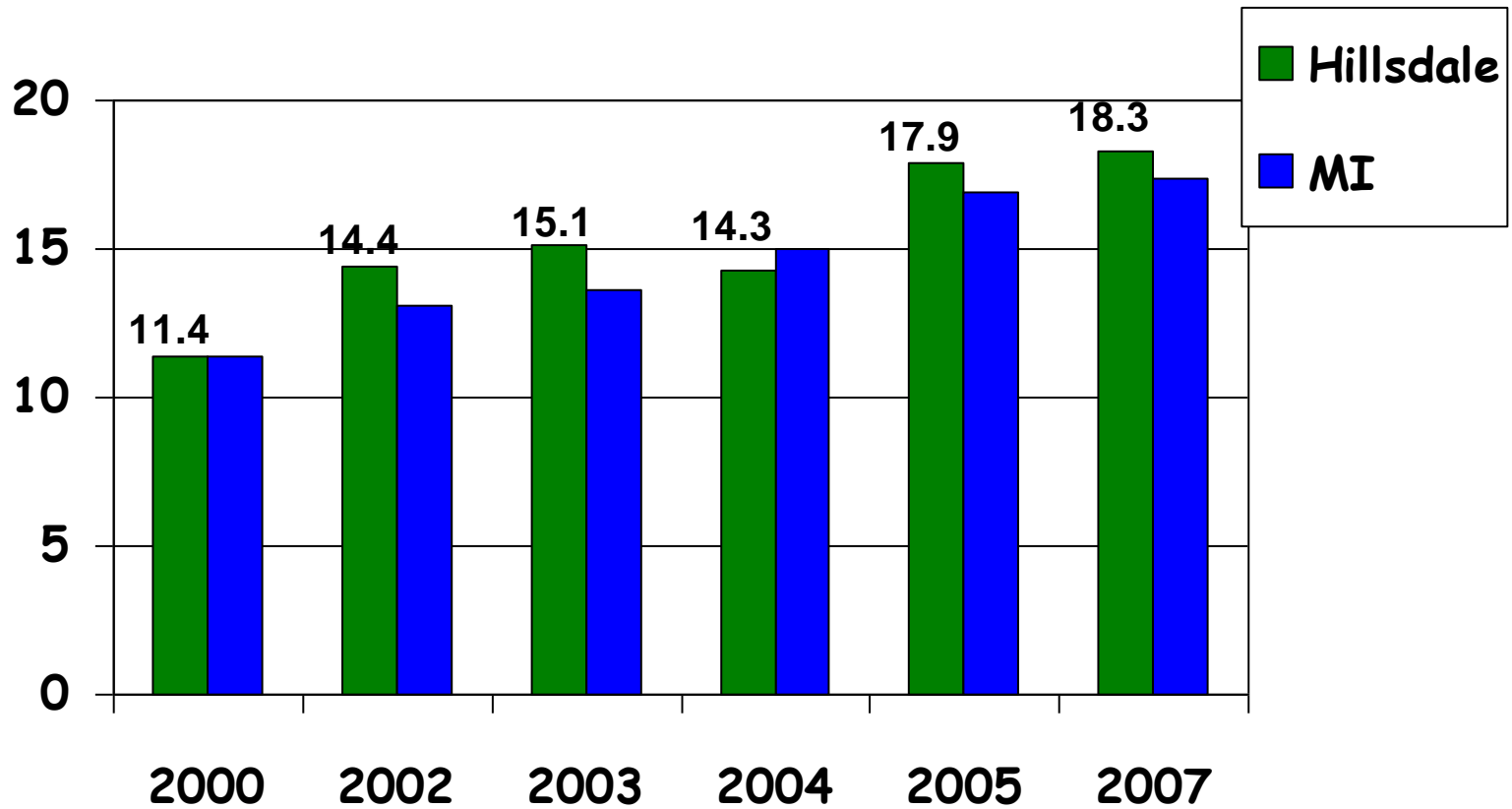


Percentage of Children Living in Poverty

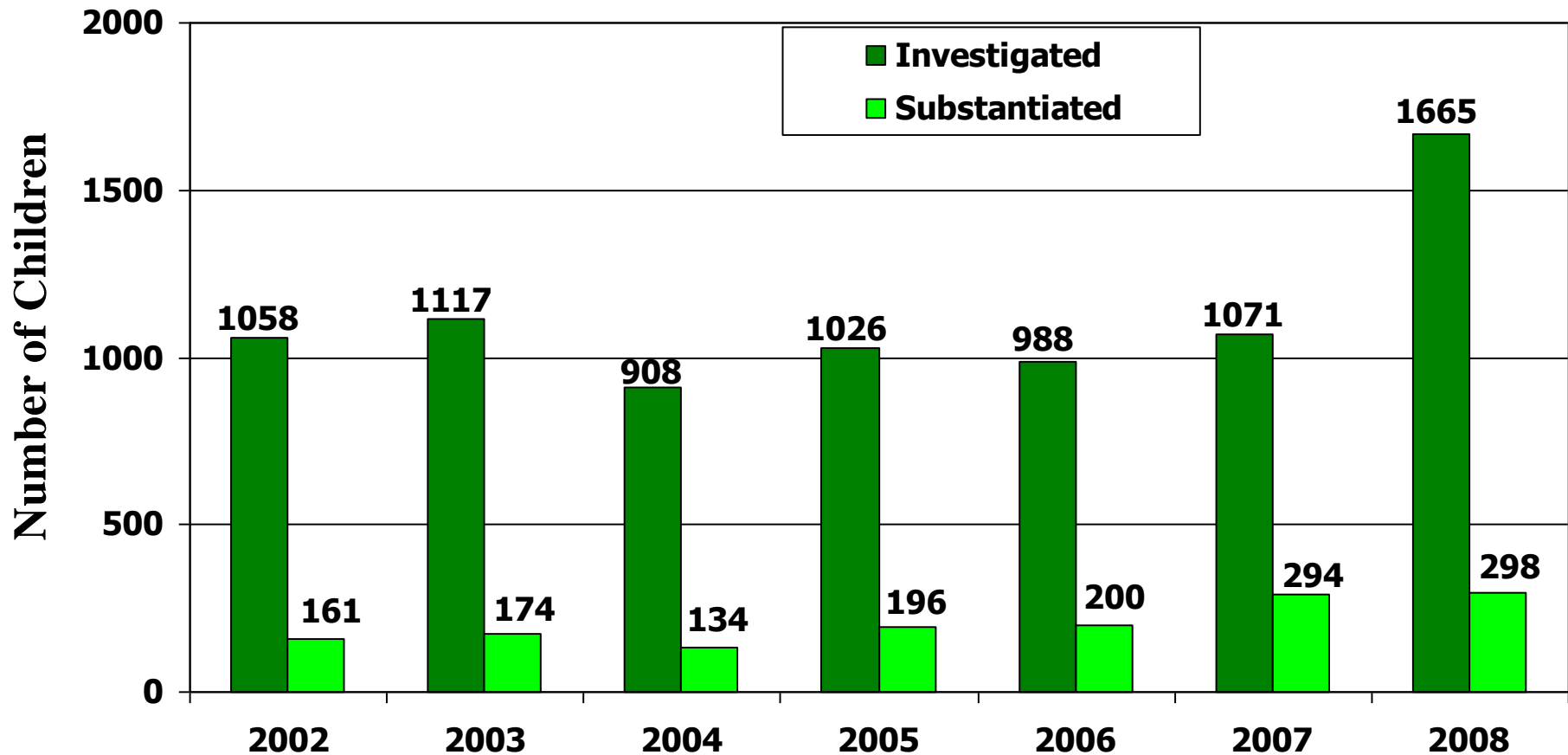

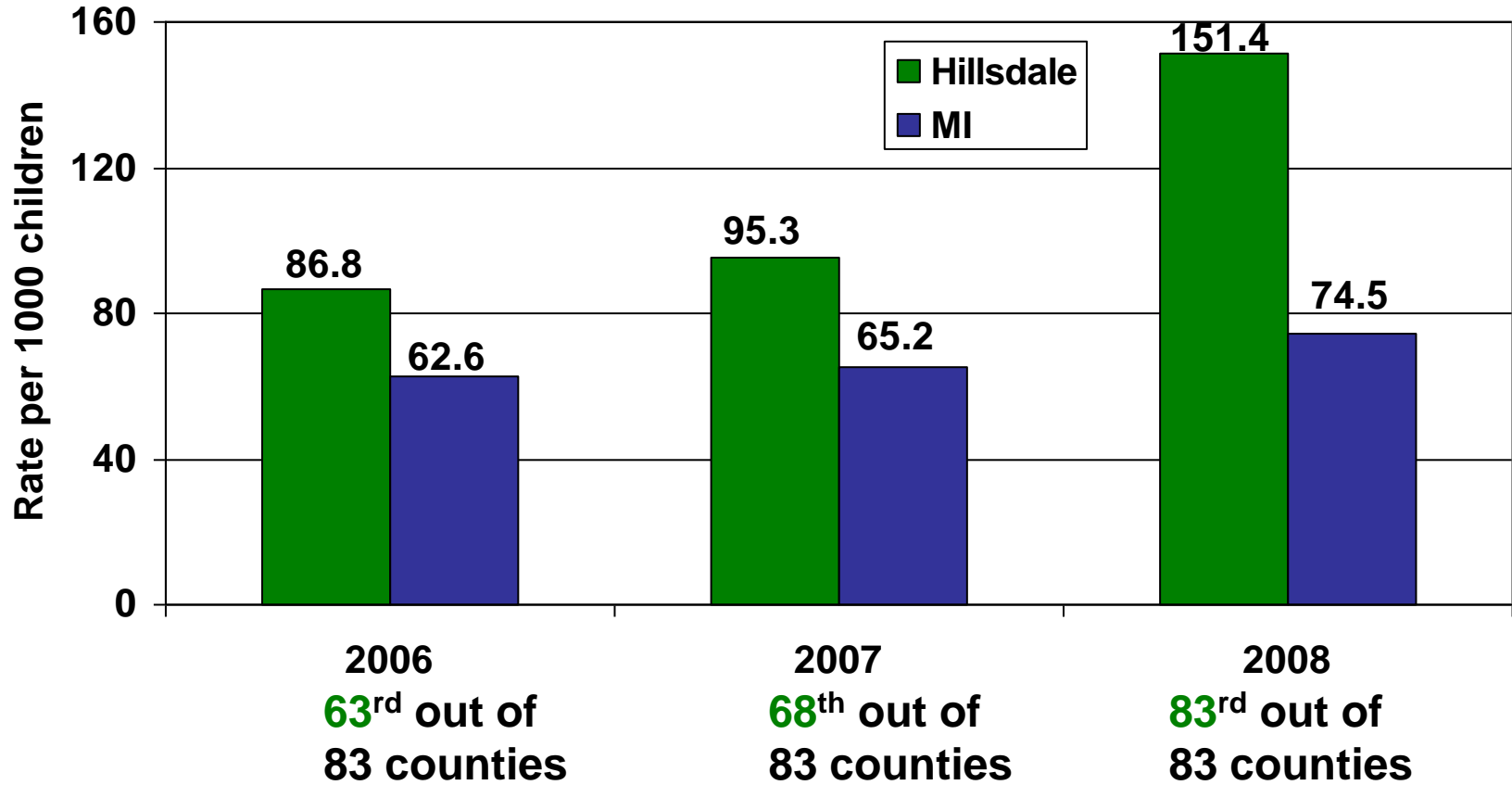


Children in Investigated Families

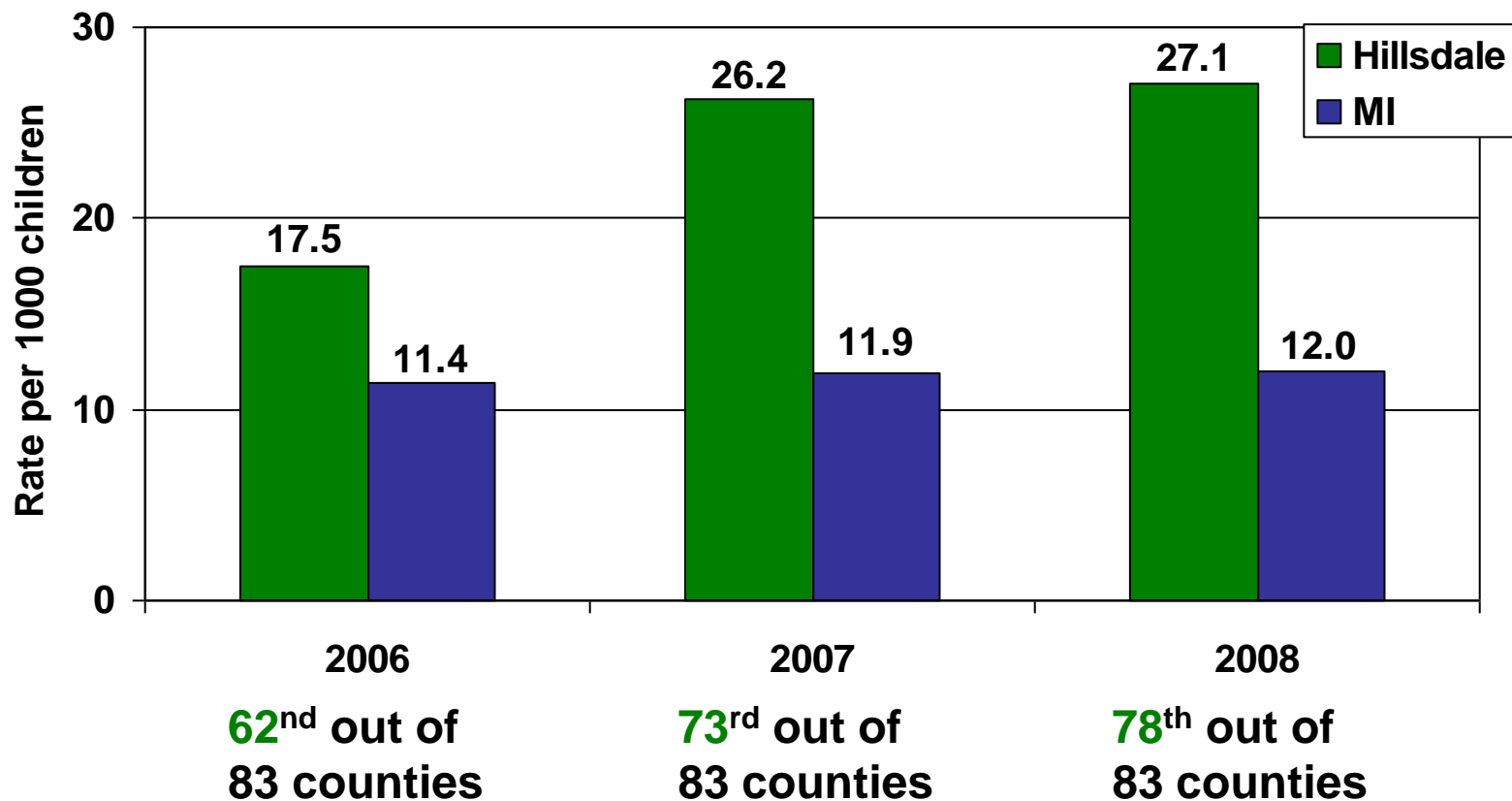


Confirmed Victims of Abuse and Neglect

Ages 0-18

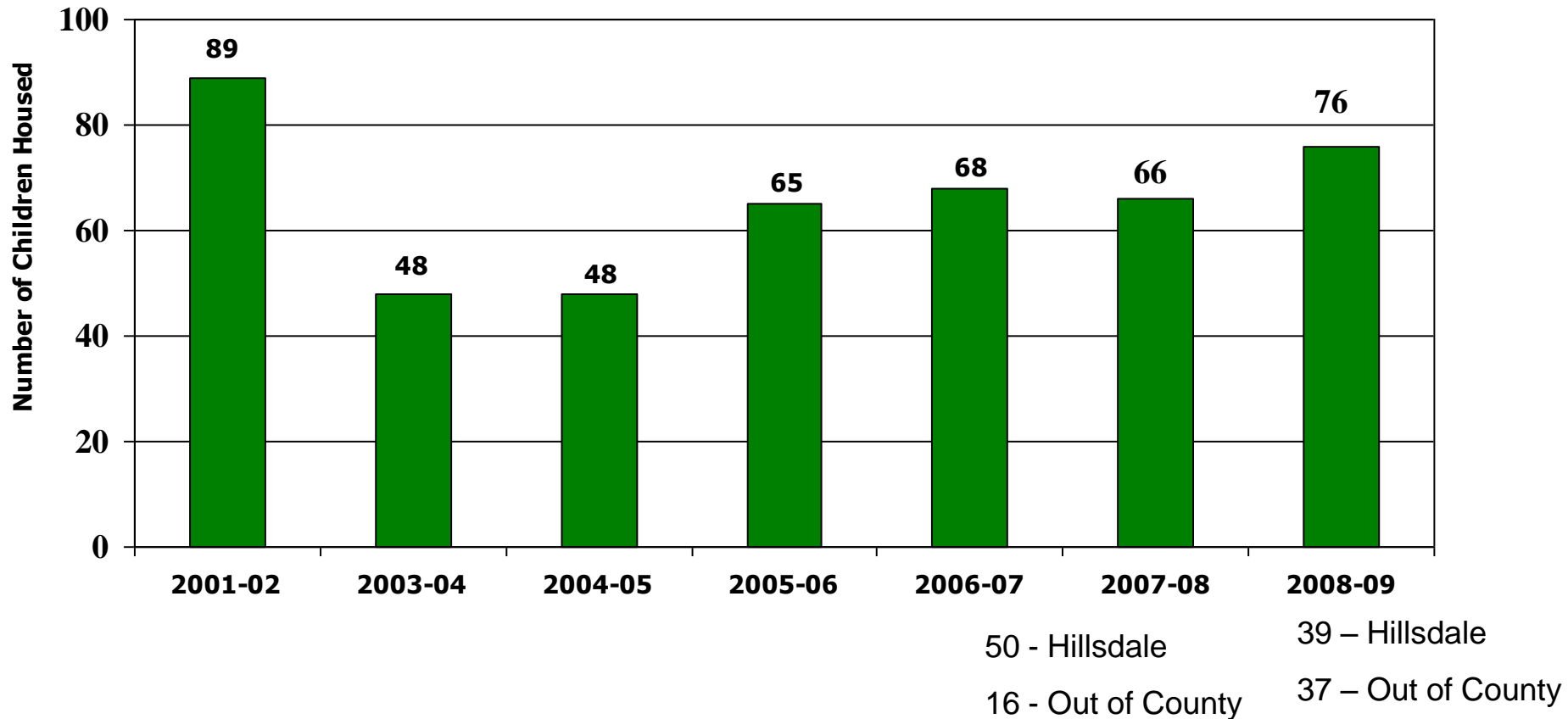

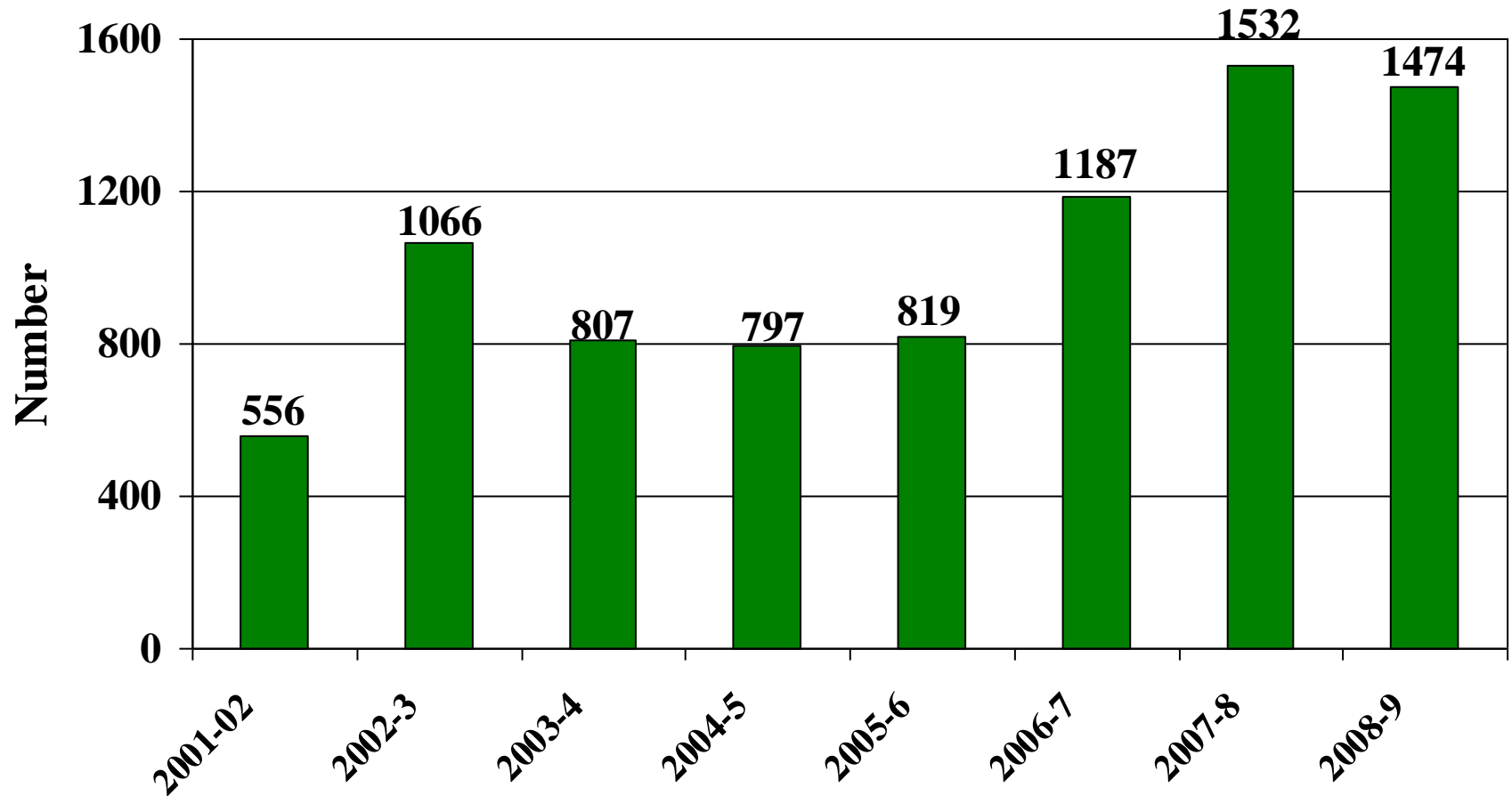
Number of children (0 to 18) housed by Domestic Violence Shelter 2001-2009 – Hillsdale Co.
